I. INTRODUCTION

- 1. The Least Developed Countries Fund for Climate Change (LDCF) and the Special Climate Change Fund (SCCF) were established by the Global Environment Facility (GEF) in response to guidance from the Conference of the Parties (COP) to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC)¹. The operations and administrative costs incurred in connection with managing both the LDCF and the SCCF are kept separate from the GEF Trust Fund.
- 2. This paper reports on the current status and approved operations under the LDCF and the SCCF.

II. LEAST DEVELOPED COUNTRIES FUND (LDCF)

Report on NAPA Operations under the LDCF

- 3. Since the last Council meeting, seven additional National Adaptation Programme of Actions (NAPAs) have been completed (Benin, Burkina Faso, Cape Verde, Mali, Sao Tomé and Principe, Uganda and Vanuatu), bringing the total of completed NAPAs to 30.
- 4. To date, the countries that have completed their NAPAs are: Bangladesh, Benin, Bhutan, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Cambodia, Cape Verde, Comoros, Democratic Republic of Congo, Djibouti, Eritrea, Guinea, Haiti, Kiribati, Lesotho, Madagascar, Malawi, Mali, Mauritania, Niger, Rwanda, Samoa, Sao Tomé and Principe, Senegal, Sudan, Tuvalu, Uganda, United Republic of Tanzania, Vanuatu and Zambia.
- 5. In addition, 14 NAPAs are in the final stages of preparation and are expected to be completed before the Council meeting in the fall of 2008. Finally, three NAPA proposals (Angola, Nepal and Timor-Leste) were approved in the second half of 2007 and are expected to be completed before the end of 2009. A complete list of NAPAs and their current status can be found in Table 1. Additionally, all completed NAPAs can be accessed through the UNFCCC website on the web links listed in Table 1. Report on Project Operations and Submissions of Projects for NAPA Implementation under the LDCF

- 6. As of February 28, 2008, eleven countries have officially submitted their NAPA implementation projects to the GEF through the Project Identification Form (PIF) for NAPA implementation under the LDCF. Among these PIFs, ten have been already approved as consistent with the LDCF eligibility criteria in the following countries: Bangladesh, Bhutan, Cambodia, Cape Verde, Eritrea, Malawi, Mauritania, Niger, Samoa and Sudan.
- 7. Eight LDCF projects, of which 4 Mid-Sized Projects (MSPs) and 4 Full-Sized Projects (FSPs) were originally approved under the provisional project cycle effective in the first half of 2007. As the LDCF project cycle was already streamlined into 2 steps, the transition to the new project cycle, adopted at the GEF Council meeting in May 2007 (GEF/C.31/7), has been remarkably smooth. To ensure transparency throughout the transition process, all PIFs approved under the old project cycle were web posted for information. Furthermore, in consistency with the procedures of the new project cycle, all projects will again be posted at the time of CEO endorsement/approval. Consequently, the LDCF work program now consists of 5 FSPs in the following countries: Bangladesh, Bhutan, Eritrea, Malawi and Sudan.
- 8. Future project submissions under the LDCF will all follow the new streamlined GEF project cycle with a few important exceptions as described in the LDCF manual (GEF/LDCF.SCCF.4/Inf.3).
- 9. In February 2008 the GEF Secretariat received the first submission for CEO endorsement under the LDCF (Bhutan: Reduce climate change-induced risks and vulnerabilities from glacial lake outbursts in the Punakha-Wangdi and Chamkhar Valleys). When approved, this project will start implementation immediately and will thus be the first concrete example of on-the-ground implementation of NAPAs. Several other LDCF projects are expected to be submitted for CEO endorsement (and thus start implementation) during 2008.

Status of Donor Contributions to the LDCF

10. The LDCF now stands at \$169 million. For more details on LDCF contributions, pledges and projections, see "Status Report on the Climate Change Fund" by the Trustee (GEF/LDCF.SCCF.4/Inf.1).

III. SPECIAL CLIMATE CHANGE FUND (SCCF)

Update on COP guidance, Council Decisions

- 11. The Special Climate Change Fund (SCCF) finances activities related to climate change that are complementary to those funded by the GEF, including:
 - (a) adaptation to climate change;
 - (b) technology transfer;
 - (c) energy, transport, industry, agriculture, forestry and waste management; and
 - (d) economic diversification.
- 12. Initially, the GEF received guidance from the COP to craft funding guidelines for items (a) and (b), only. At COP 12, the GEF Secretariat received additional guidance on how to operationalize a program in the areas of (c) and (d). The subsequent results can be found in document GEF/LDCF.SCCF.2/4/Rev.1, *Programming to Implement the Guidance for the Special Climate Change Fund adopted by the Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change at its Twelfth Session*. The remainder of this document refers solely to the SCCF adaptation program.

Report on project operations and submissions of projects under the SCCF Adaptation Program

- 13. There have been no additional projects entered into the SCCF work program since the last Council meeting in November 2007. The total number of work program approved SCCF Adaptation Program projects are thus still nine (4 MSPs and 5 FSPs) totaling \$33.5 million. One additional project (Regional: 'Pacific Islands Adaptation to Climate Change Project (PACC)' totaling \$14.7 million) is being proposed for work program inclusion at the present Council meeting (GEF/LDCF.SCCF.4/3), should this be approved the total of SCCF Adaptation Program projects would go up to \$48.2 million.
- 14. The pipeline for the SCCF Program for Adaptation contains an additional seven projects, which are expected to be submitted to the SCCF/LDCF Council as part of work programs before the next Council meeting in the fall of 2008. Together, these projects are expected to request approximately \$29.3 million of funding from the SCCF Program for Adaptation. A complete list of approved and pipeline projects under the SCCF Program for Adaptation can be found in Table 3 and 4.
- 15. Funding for the project proposal included in the current work program and the current pipeline would require \$79 million from the SCCF Program for Adaptation. As total pledges to the Adaptation Program of the SCCF are now \$74.6 million, programming under this program cannot continue beyond 2008. As a result, the GEF Secretariat in February 2007 decided to close the pipeline for new submissions under the SCCF Adaptation Program until new funding becomes available. With recent injection of funds to the SCCF, however, there is now a small window of around \$14 million

available for immediate programming (in addition to the funds proposed for allocation under this work program). In coordination with IAs, available funds will be allocated to the highest priority projects in the current pipeline, and submitted for council approval in an upcoming intersessional work program. As the funding situation remains fundamentally unchanged, however, the pipeline will not be reopened for new submissions at the current time. Donors are therefore urgently requested to make further contributions to the SCCF Program for Adaptation.
