## **AGENDA**

The Least Developed Countries Fund (LDCF) is the only multilateral fund that focuses exclusively on the unique climate adaptation challenges of Least Developed Countries (LDCs) and is widely embraced by LDCs as their own. It was established in 2001 as one of the climate change adaptation funds of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC). Since the Paris Agreement entered into force in November 2016, Parties have further entrusted the LDCF to deepen its key role in areas such as strengthening LDCs' adaptive capacity and resilience to climate change. The LDCF is part of the family of funds managed by the Global Environment Facility.

The Fund has a strong track record of supporting LDCs to build climate resilience and to address adaptation priorities. The LDCF delivers targeted support to the world's most vulnerable countries, and their people and ecosystems. 51 current and graduated LDCs gained access to more than US\$1.7 billion of grant since creation of the LDCF through close to 400 projects, programs and enabling activities, catalysing more than \$7.1 billion in co-financing. This has directly benefited more than 60 million people and strengthened management of over 9.6 million hectares of land.

The LDCF supports systemic, integrated programs with the GEF Trust Fund and other partners, such as the Green Climate Fund (GCF). A prime example of partnership to catalyze action is the Great Green Wall initiative of Africa, which aims to restore the continents' degraded landscapes and transform millions of lives in the Sahel region. This initiative has been supported with the GEF, the LDCF, and the GCF, along with various other bilateral and multilateral institutions.

Despite the progress being made, LDCs remain highly vulnerable to the impacts of climate change. The latest IPCC report, highlights, with very high confidence that "global warming, reaching 1.5°C in the nearterm, would cause avoidable increase in multiple climate hazards and presents multiple risks to ecosystem and humans", and underscores the role of "adaptation" in reducing the risks.

This urgent call for climate adaptation action demands political attention and financing for catalyzing action in LDCs. In line with this urgency, the GEF's new climate change adaptation strategy<sup>1</sup> outlines priority areas and adopted ambitious financial scenarios.

At this event, Heads of State and/or Ministers will share their insights on how the GEF is catalysing adaptation action with concrete positive impacts for their economies, environment, and people in their countries.
