PROGRESS REPORT ON THE LEAST DEVELOPED COUNTRIES FUND
AND THE SPECIAL CLIMATE CHANGE FUND

Recommended Council Decision

The LDCF/SCCF Council, having considered document GEF/LDCF.SCCF.35/05/Rev.01 *Progress Report on the Least Developed Countries Fund and the Special Climate Change Fund*, welcomes the report and takes note with appreciation the progress made under the LDCF and the SCCF.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 1. This report provides an update on the progress made in the operations of the Least Developed Countries Fund (LDCF) and the Special Climate Change Fund (SCCF) during the reporting period between April 1, 2023 and September 30, 2023. The financial status updates provided by the Trustee of the LDCF and SCCF are as of December 31, 2023.
- 2. As of December 31, 2023, total cumulative pledges and signed contribution agreements to the LDCF amounted to \$2,215.64 million from 28 donors. The total resources received was \$2.211.33 million, which is 94.0 percent of total potential resources. Cumulative LDCF funding decisions by the LDCF/SCCF Council and the CEO amounted to \$1,826.65 million. Resources available for new funding decisions amounted to \$384.68 million.
- 3. During the period of April 1, 2023 to December 31, 2023, a total of \$204.41 million in new pledges were made from Belgium, France, Germany, Ireland, Norway, Slovenia, Spain, and Sweden. After the current reporting period ended, a pledging event was held at the 28th meeting of the Conference of the Parties (COP) to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) and the 5th Meeting of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement, at which Belgium, Canada, France, Germany, Norway, Spain, Sweden, and the United Kingdom pledged a total of \$174.24 million to the LDCF and SCCF.³ Additionally, Ireland pledged 4.68 million euros to the LDCF and SCCF at COP 28.
- 4. Since inception, the LDCF has approved 391 projects. During this reporting period, five LDCF Full-Sized Projects (FSPs) were approved at the 34th LDCF/SCCF Council as part of the June 2023 Work Program. Ten LDCF projects were CEO endorsed for implementation.
- 5. 21 projects requesting a total of \$203.40 million are presented to the 35th LDCF/SCCF Council in February 2024 for approval, of which \$180.40 million is for the LDCF and \$23.00 million is for the SCCF. This is the third Work Program of the GEF-8 Period. The LDCF/SCCF Work Program constitution follows the operational improvements agreed by the 32nd LDCF/SCCF Council in June 2022, as stipulated in the GEF Programming Strategy on Adaptation to Climate Change for the Least Developed Countries Fund and Special Climate Change Fund for the GEF-8 period of July 2, 2022, to June 30, 2026 and operational improvements.⁵
- 6. As of September 30, 2023, 51 least developed countries (LDCs) accessed approximately \$12.20 million in support of the preparation of national adaptation programs of action (NAPAs).

Additionally, LDCF support for formulation of national adaptation plan (NAP) processes totaled \$60.33 million as of September 30, 2023. The figures are consistent with information provided in the previous Progress Report, presented to the 34th LDCF/SCCF Council in June 2023.⁶

- 7. Since GEF-7, the LDCF has focused on the NAP implementation, as countries are eligible to receive support from the Green Climate Fund (GCF) for NAP formulation.
- 8. The LDCF portfolio aims to reduce the vulnerability of an estimated 60.79 million people and better manage 9.98 million hectares of land to withstand the effects of climate change. Further, 2.26 million people will be trained to identify, prioritize, implement, monitor and/or evaluate adaptation strategies and measures. Additionally, LDCF projects are expected to develop or strengthen 3,193 policies, plans and frameworks to identify, prioritize, and integrate adaptation strategies and measures.
- 9. As for the SCCF, cumulative pledges amounted to \$432.95 million as of December 31, 2023. The total resources received was \$418.61 million, which is 90.7 percent of total potential resources. Cumulative SCCF funding decisions by the Council and the CEO amounted to \$369.99 million. Funds available to support Council or CEO decision were \$48.70 million as of December 31, 2023. \$35.03 million in new pledges were received for the SCCF during the period of April 1, 2022 to December 31, 2023, from Canada, Ireland, Spain, and United Kingdom.
- 10. Since its inception, the SCCF has approved support for 96 projects, including 22 Multi Trust Fund Projects (MTFs). During the reporting period, two new FSPs had their PIF approved for a total of \$3.50 million, and one MSP was CEO approved for \$0.54 million. Two of these three projects are MTFs with the LDCF supported through SCCF window B by the Challenge Program for Adaptation Innovation.
- 11. New funding commitments and contributions made during this reporting period for SCCF have focused primarily on the climate change adaptation priorities of Small Island Development States. The SCCF's window B focused on technology transfer, innovation, and provide sector engagement, is still under-resourced despite its demonstrated strong potential for impact and engagement of non-traditional partners in the GEF including private sector actors.
- 12. The SCCF portfolio aims to reduce the vulnerability of an estimated 8.92 million people and better manage 5.17 million hectares of land to withstand the effects of climate change. Further, 222,519 people will be trained to identify, prioritize, implement, monitor and/or evaluate adaptation strategies and measures. Additionally, SCCF projects are expected to

develop or strengthen 522 policies, plans and frameworks to identify, prioritize, and integrate adaptation strategies and measures.

13. Progress made by the Challenge Program for Adaptation Innovation continues to demonstrate its potential to effectively address unmet needs for climate change adaptation innovation. This program has successfully forged partnerships with a growing set of climate adaptation innovation leaders, particularly in the private sector, which the GEF has not been able to engage through more traditional programming modalities. All 19 projects have been approved by the CEO through the two initial rounds of this challenge program, at the time of publication of this report.

Introduction

1. This report provides an update on progress made in the operations of the Least Developed Countries Fund (LDCF) and the Special Climate Change Fund (SCCF) since the inception of the two funds, as well as specific activities during the reporting period of April 1, 2023, to September 30, 2023. Table 1 below presents a summary of LDCF and SCCF operations, including total cumulative pledges, paid contributions, and project approvals. Dollar figures in this table are based on information from the current Trustee Status Reports for the LDCF and SCCF as of December 31, 2023.

- 2. Table 2 presents a numerical summary of progress made in Fiscal Year (FY) 2023, from July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023.
- 3. During the 32nd meeting of the LDCF/SCCF Council on June 23, 2022, the Council approved the GEF Programming Strategy on Adaptation to Climate Change for the LDCF and SCCF for the GEF-8 Period of July 1, 2022, to June 30, 2026 and Operational Improvements. The strategy was fully informed by the latest scientific findings, including reports from Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC), the Independent Evaluation Office's 2020 Program Evaluation of the LDCF¹⁷ and the 2021 Program Evaluation of the SCCF. ¹⁸ It is also responsive to the guidance received from the Conference of the Parties (COP) to the United Nations Framework Convention

4. The GEF Secretariat also continued actively engaging throughout this reporting period on the roll out of the Dedicated Programs, as defined in the GEF-8 Programming Strategy on Adaptation to Climate Change. Progress being made through the Dedicated Programs is detailed in paragraphs 55 to 80.

LEAST DEVELOPED COUNTRIES FUND

Pledges and Contributions to the LDCF

- 5. As of December 31, 2023, total cumulative donor pledges and signed contribution agreements to the LDCF amounted to \$2,215.64 million from 28 donors.²³ The total resources received was \$2.211.33 million, which is 94.0 percent of total potential resources.²⁴
- 6. Also as of December 31, 2023, LDCF resources available for funding decisions amounted to \$384.68 million.
- 7. A total of \$204.41 million in new pledges were made to the LDCF during the period of April 1, 2023 to December 31, 2023. Contributions received during this same period totaled



\$200.19 million from Belgium, Denmark, Germany, Ireland, Norway, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, and United States of America. Annex IV presents detailed Trustee information. Figure 1 shows total annual and cumulative LDCF contributions finalized for each fiscal year.²⁵

After the current reporting period, a successful donor pledging event was held at the 28th UN Climate Change Conference, at which eight donors pledged a total of \$174.2 million to the LDCF and SCCF. 27 Pledges to the LDCF totaled \$141.74 million from six countries, namely Belgium, France, Germany, Norway, Spain, and Sweden, and pledges to the SCCF totaled \$32.5 million from three countries. Additionally, Ireland pledged \$2.50 million euros to the LDCF and 2.18 million euros to the SCCF. Denmark, Ireland, the Netherlands, and Switzerland expressed political support to the LDCF/SCCF.

Progress in LDCF Operations

9. During the reporting period, five projects were approved by the LDCF/SCCF Council as part of the June 2023 Work Program, for a total of \$61.23 million in GEF project financing and

Agency fees. All projects submitted were technically cleared and supported. This includes national projects for Comoros, Djibouti, Zambia, and Bhutan, as well as a global project.

- 10. As of September 30, 2023, the LDCF has provided \$12.20 million in direct support of the preparation of National Adaptation Programs of Action (NAPAs). ²⁸ The LDCF and SCCF completed its support for NAPA preparation in GEF-6, while it continues to support their implementation as appropriate. South Sudan was the last country to submit its NAPA to the UNFCCC in 2017, bringing the total number of countries that had completed and submitted their NAPAs to 51.²⁹
- 11. In addition to financing the urgent and immediate adaptation needs of LDCs and the LDC work programme, the LDCF is also mandated to support National Adaptation Planning (NAP) processes, which is an iterative and ongoing process enabling medium and long-term planning for adaptation. As of September 30, 2023, total funding from the LDCF toward LDCs' NAP formulation processes amounts to \$60.33 million. In this includes projects in Chad, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Djibouti, Guinea-Bissau, Lao PDR, Niger, Rwanda, São Tomé and Príncipe, and Senegal. This also includes three global projects with LDCF resources amounting to \$13.69 million approved to support the preparation of the NAP process in LDCs, and the implementation of elements of the LDC work programme other than NAPAs. The three global projects to support the preparation of the NAP process have all been fully implemented and financially closed.
- 12. The GCF and GEF have continued to work together to offer streamlined and coordinated support to countries and to avoid overlap, including as related to the NAP process. GCF and GEF coordination on climate change adaptation projects enable countries to move more effectively towards the integration of climate change adaptation considerations across key policies, plans, programs and decision-making processes, in line with guidance from the COP to the UNFCCC, ³² as well as a LDCF/SCCF Council decision to operationalize support towards NAP process. ³³

13. Cumulative LDCF funding decisions amount to a total of \$1,818.11 million.³⁴ Projects support the implementation of priorities defined in NAPAs and NAPs, as well as other elements of the LDCF work program (see Figure 2).

LDCF Resource Access for GEF-8 Period

14. For the GEF-8 period starting on July 1, 2022, the LDCF initial resource access cap for which each LDC can draw doubled to \$20 million. Table 3 shows the GEF-8 and cumulative status of LDCF resources accessed by each LDCF, as of September 30, 2023. As Bhutan graduated from LDC status in December 2023, Bhutan's full \$20 million in LDCF finance was programmed in the June 2023 Work Program.

Agency Involvement in LDCF Projects

- 15. Since the LDCF inception to September 30, 2023, 12 GEF Agencies have been involved in LDCF projects and programs. United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) has the largest share of project funding approvals, with 47 percent, the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) at 14 percent and United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) at 12 percent, as shown in Figure 3. Other GEF Agencies implementing LDCF projects are Asian Development Bank (ADB), African Development Bank (AfDB), Banque Ouest Africaine de Développement (West African Development Bank, BOAD), Conservation International (CI), International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD), International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN), United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO), World Wildlife Fund-US (WWF-US) and World Bank.³⁷
- 16. Following guidance of the Council and the GEF-8 policy recommendations, progress is continuing to be made for more balanced distribution of LDCF financing among Agencies including an aspirational ceiling for any one Agency of no more than 30 percent and an aspirational target for the regional multilateral banks and IFAD of 10 percent of the approved amounts.





Figure 4: Distribution of LDCF Financing by GEF Agency in GEF-8 as of September 30, 2023 (\$ million as of September 30, 2023)³⁹

- 17. Thus far in GEF-8, five agencies have been involved in LDCF projects, including UNIDO, UNDP, UNEP, IFAD, and FAO. UNDP has the largest share of the project funding approvals with 39 percent, followed by UNEP with 19 percent as shown in Figure 4 provided by the Trustee. With the approval of the large LDCF/SCCF Work Program at the 35th LDCF/SCCF Council meeting, the GEF-8 share of the regional banks and IFAD will increase to 22 percent, and over 33 percent including the World Bank. The highest share of programming by a single Agency will decrease to 32 percent for the GEF-8 period.

Figure 3: Distribution of Cumulative LDCF Financing by GEF Agency as of December 31, 2023 (\$ million)³⁸

CEO Endorsements

- 18. During the reporting period, ten LDCF projects (including 2 MTF projects) totaling \$55.95 million in GEF project financing were CEO endorsed or CEO approved (see Table 4).
- 19. The revised Project Cancellation Policy that took effect March 1, 2019 has been applied to improve the operational efficiency of the GEF.⁴⁰ Under this revised policy, if a FSP has not been submitted for CEO endorsement within 12 months of the date of Council approval or if it has not been CEO endorsed after 18 months, the project may be subject to cancellation. All projects approved in the June 2019 LDCF Work Program and thereafter fall under the revised Cancellation Policy. The actual time between the PIF approval and CEO endorsement of all FSPs during this reporting period ranged from 11 months to over 2 years, with the average time between PIF approval and CEO endorsement being 19 months.

- 20. In total, 343 projects⁴¹ had been CEO endorsed or approved as of September 30, 2023, including the ten projects during this reporting period as reflected in Table 4.
- 21. Since the revised cancellation policy took effect on March 1, 2019, 16 projects submitted notifications of delayed submission of CEO endorsement request to delay the final date required

for CEO endorsement or approval of LDCF projects by invoking *force majeure* during the reporting period of the FY22 Annual Monitoring Review (AMR) of the LDCF and SCCF.⁴²

Expected Results under the LDCF

- 22. Key expected results of the approved LDCF projects are summarized in Table 5.⁴³ Full expected results can be found in the results frameworks specific to each project, available in the project documents posted on the GEF website.⁴⁴
- 23. In response to the request made at the 14th LDCF/SCCF Council meeting in June 2013, the GEF Secretariat, in its AMR of the LDCF and the SCCF, continues to provide a summary of actual, portfolio-level results of projects that have been completed or that are under implementation. The AMR reporting results from the FY 22 will be presented at the February 2024 35th LDCF/SCCF Council.⁴⁵
- 24. The LDCF's portfolio of approved projects seek to directly reduce the vulnerability of more than 60.79 million people. LDCF projects are supporting countries in their efforts to integrate climate change adaptation into an expected 3,193 policies, plans, and processes to identify, prioritize, and integrate adaptation strategies and measures. The LDCF also assists countries in laying the groundwork for climate-resilient development by training an expected 2.26 million people to identify, prioritize, implement, monitor and/or evaluation adaptation strategies and measures.

- 25. Since the start of GEF-6 in July 2014, which is when LDCF/SCCF began systematically tracking sex disaggregated data, 19.47 million of the 42.76 million (45.53 percent) expected project beneficiaries of LDCF projects are female, and 756,063 of the 1.56 million (48.37 percent) expected people trained are female.
- 26. The LDCF and SCCF results framework has been updated for GEF-8 projects, as presented in the GEF-8 Strategy on Adaptation to Climate Change. Updates include a new core indicator related to private sector engagement, a new core sub-indicator on hectares of coastal or marine area managed climate resilience and tracking of age disaggregation. The updated results framework is used for all newly approved projects LDCF and SCCF projects in GEF-8.
- 27. The five LDCF projects approved in the reporting period are expected to directly benefit 614,699 people (49.8 percent women), bring 355,900 hectares of land under climate resilience, strengthen climate adaptation in 29 policies or frameworks, train 152,524 people (50.0 percent women), and result in 103 private sector enterprises engaged in climate change adaptation and resilience action.
- 28. The GEF Policy on Gender Equality and GEF Policy on Stakeholder Engagement also apply to LDCF projects. 50
- 29. The following are examples of projects that were CEO endorsed during this reporting period, with a brief description of their expected results and impacts.

- 30. Accelerating investment in nature-based solutions (NBS) to help address climate adaptation in Least Developed Countries (LDCs). (GEF ID: 10961); GEF Agency: World Bank; GEF project financing: \$11.00 million; Co-financing: \$92.50 million. The project will enhance the uptake of NBS to address climate adaptation challenges and provide benefits for nature in LDCs. This will be achieved through three interconnected pillars. Pillar 1 will provide global upstream analytics to contribute to building the case for NBS through tools, best practices, innovative financing, and policy dialogues, benefiting all LDCs. Pillar 2 will offer country-scale support to promote NBS investments by providing technical assistance, building technical capacities for NBS design, funding, and implementation, and supporting LDCs engagement in NBS at an international stage. Pillar 3 will benefit all LDCs through knowledge management and learning exchange, and dissemination of NBS, including lessons/experience sharing workshops for LDCs. At least 5,000 (50 percent women) government professionals, technical experts, and task team experts working in LDCs will benefit from training, knowledge exchange and capacity building.
- 31. Promotion of climate adaptation technology and business model innovations and entrepreneurship in Sierra Leone (GEF ID: 10680); GEF Agency: UNIDO; GEF project financing (LDCF): \$10 million; Co-financing: \$26.99 million. The project will reduce vulnerability and increase resilience of vulnerable populations by supporting micro, small, and medium enterprise (MSME) driven innovation, transfer and large-scale deployment of adaptation technologies, products and services (TPS) in the water, agriculture and energy sectors of Sierra Leone. The LDCF financing will build the capacity of MSMEs in the country to provide adequate and prioritized adaptation TPS to the most vulnerable sectors, by providing information and building the capacity of MSMEs on climate change, adaptation and entrepreneurship as a mechanism to stimulate innovation, create new businesses and employment opportunities as well as testing ideas and concepts applicable to the target sectors. The project will deliver direct adaptation benefits to 131,000 people and increase areas managed for climate resilience by 26,000 hectares. It will also mainstream climate resilience in four policies and plans, and train over 6,000 people in climate risk management approaches.

Sectoral Distribution




Figure 5: Sectoral Distribution of LDCF Projects Since Inception

32. Each LDCF project is focused on one or more sectors/themes. Figure 5 provides a breakdown of the cumulative sectoral distribution of all LDCF projects since inception. Agriculture, water, and climate information services are the themes with the greatest focus among all LDCF projects, followed by the nature-based solutions.

SPECIAL CLIMATE CHANGE FUND

Pledges and Contributions to the SCCF

- 33. As of December 31, 2023, donor pledges and contributions amounted to \$432.95 million. ⁵¹ Of this, \$397.50 million, or 91.8 percent were contributions. ⁵² Figure 6 presents annual SCCF contributions and cumulative resources received by fiscal year.
- 34. During the period of April 1, 2023 to December 31, 2023, \$27.38 million in new contributions were received for the SCCF from Canada, Denmark, Germany, Ireland, Spain, Switzerland, and United Kingdom. Funds available to support the Council or CEO approval were \$48.70 million as of September 30, 2023. Shortly after this reporting period, a successful donor pledging event was held at COP 28, at which 8 donors pledged a total of \$174.2 million to the

LDCF and SCCF, of which pledges to the SCCF totaled \$32.5 million from Canada, Spain, and the United Kingdom.⁵³ Additionally, Ireland pledged 2.18 million euros to the SCCF.

Progress in SCCF Operations


35. As of December 31, 2023, cumulative funding decisions by the Council and the CEO amounted to a total of \$369.99 million, according to the Trustee Status Report for the SCCF. Of the total amount approved, \$324.86 million was for projects and project preparation activities, \$32.12 million was for fees, and \$13.01 million was for administrative expenses and corporate activities of the SCCF. There is a total of 96 projects approved under the SCCF since inception. Annex II presents a complete list of approved projects to date under SCCF-A and B. Figure 7 shows SCCF approvals by fiscal year.

Approvals and CEO Endorsements

- 36. During the reporting period, two new FSPs had their PIFs approved. These projects total \$3.50 million in support from SCCF finance which include GEF project grant, Agency fees, PPG, and PPG fees. One of these projects was supported through the Challenge Program for Adaptation Innovation, and the other was an MTF with the LDCF and window B for technology transfer, innovation, and private sector engagement.
- 37. One MSP was CEO approved during this reporting period, as shown in Table 6. This project is an MTF with the LDCF that is supported by the SCCF with \$0.54 million, inclusive of agency fees and PPG, as a project of the Challenge Program for Adaptation Innovation.

- 38. SCCF window A for SIDS received increased support during this reporting period, while at the end of this reporting period window B for technology transfer, innovation and private sector engagement continued to be resource constrained. Shortly after this reporting period, at the 28th UN Climate Change Conference, new support was pledged to both SCCF windows A and B. The support pledged for SCCF window B can enable a new round of the Challenge Program for Adaptation Innovation and other innovative programing opportunities.
- 39. In total, 92 SCCF projects had been CEO endorsed or approved as of September 30, 2023.
- 40. The following are examples of projects that were PIF approved during this reporting period, with a brief description of their expected results and impacts.
- 41. Climate change adaptation of Cabo Verde's agri-food systems for improved food security and livelihoods (GEF ID 11100, Cabo Verde, Agency: FAO, SCCF financing: \$3.00 million⁵⁸). The objective of the project is to enhance Cabo Verde's adaptive capacity through agro-ecological adaptation solutions, enhanced governance and capital, and a whole-of-society approach, delivering food security and sustainable livelihoods. The project targets the Santiago Island, which has the largest land area used for agriculture (52.5 percent) in the country and offers points of entry to introduce agroecology and support more productive food systems. The project's components embrace transformation levers of capacity for change, governance and policy, multistakeholder dialogue, innovation and learning, and financial leverage. Component 1 promotes an enabling environment for integrated and transformational adaptation, and access to climate financing. Component 2 demonstrates nature-based solutions and innovations in selected

watersheds through agroecology and sustainable livelihoods including developing new value chains targeting women and youth. Component 3 supports the co-creation of knowledge and the sharing of learning through public-private, public-academic partnerships, with a focus to capacitate youth. The project also complements the Adaptation Fund project (Increasing the resilience of local communities to climate change through improved watershed management and land restoration) and provides the added value of piloting new value chains, access to skills and credentials by youth, partnerships among government, and private sector and academia. The project is expected to benefit 22,684 people (52 percent female), place 8,628 hectares of agriculture land and 150 hectares of coastal and marine area under climate resilient management, strengthen 33 policies/plans for climate adaptation, train and raise the awareness 1200 people (51 percent female) on climate change and engage 15 private sector enterprises in climate change adaptation and resilience action.

- 42. Amplifying the impact of the "Challenge Programme for Adaptation Innovation" of the Global Environment Facility through learning and knowledge management (GEF ID 11303, Global, Agency: UNIDO, SCCF financing: \$0.50 million⁵⁹). This MTF project will strengthen innovation and the role of the private sector in accelerating climate adaptation innovation through learning and knowledge management. The project will capture and share learning from projects supported through the Challenge Program for Adaptation Innovation, to strengthen design and implementation of other LDCF and SCCF projects, including but not limited to the Challenge Program for Adaptation Innovation, as well as help advance the practices of engaged stakeholders more broadly. Supported by a central website and learning strategy, three communities of practice will be managed by key partners throughout the life of the project to overcome timely challenges and opportunities for innovation and private sector engagement in climate adaptation. These will focus on design, capitalization, and management of investment funds; MSME incubation and acceleration; and impacts and measures metrics with private sector perspectives. The project will train 1,554 people (50 percent of which will be female) and engage 50 private sector enterprises.
- 43. There was no new MSP supported by only SCCF that had CEO approval or being prepared for CEO approval during this reporting period.

Agency Involvement in SCCF Projects


44. As of December 31, 2023, 13 GEF Agencies were involved in SCCF projects.⁶⁰ The total cumulative share of SCCF resources by MDBs and IFAD remains significant, currently totaling 51 percent of all resources. Since inception, the World Bank holds the largest share at 25 percent (\$82 million), followed closely by UNDP at 25 percent (\$81 million), then IFAD at 11 percent, and UNEP at 10 percent, as shown in Figure 8.⁶¹

Figure 8: Distribution of Cumulative SCCF Financing by Agency, as of December 31, 2023 (\$ million)⁶²




- 45. Following guidance of the Council and the GEF-8 policy recommendations, efforts are continuing to be made for balanced distribution of SCCF financing among Agencies including an aspirational ceiling for any one Agency of no more than 30 percent and an aspirational target for the regional multilateral banks and IFAD of 10 percent of the approved amounts. These targets are currently achieved for SCCF projects since inception.
- 46. In GEF-8, as of September 30, 2023, only two GEF Agencies have had SCCF projects approved, of which 75.0 percent is with FAO for one project under SCCF window A, and 25.0 percent with UNIDO for two projects under SCCF window B. The small portfolio size does not allow for meaningful statistical analysis. It will continue to be monitored.

Expected Results under the SCCF

- 47. By the end of the reporting period, 92 of 96 SCCF projects have been endorsed or approved by the CEO.⁶³ Of these projects, 52 have completed implementation.⁶⁴
- 48. Table 7 provides a summary of the quantitative results indicators from SCCF projects.⁶⁵ Full expected results are detailed in the results frameworks specific to each project, available in the project documents posted on the GEF website.⁶⁶ In response to a request made at the 14th LDCF/SCCF Council in June 2013, the Secretariat, in its Annual Monitoring Reviews of the LDCF and the SCCF, continues to provide a summary of actual portfolio-level results of projects.⁶⁷
- 49. Projects approved for SCCF support aim to directly reduce the vulnerability of 8.92 million people. Furthermore, SCCF projects support countries in their efforts to develop or strengthen an estimated 522 policies, plans, and processes that identify, prioritize, and integrate climate change adaptation strategies and measures. Additionally, SCCF projects train an estimated 222,519 people to identify, prioritize, implement, monitor and/or evaluate adaptation strategies and measures.

- 50. Since the start of GEF-6 in July 2014, which is when LDCF/SCCF began systematically tracking sex disaggregated data, 1.20 million of the 2.54 million (47.2 percent) expected project beneficiaries of SCCF projects are female, and 27,657 of the 60,377 (45.8 percent) expected people trained are female.
- 51. The two SCCF projects approved in the reporting period are expected to directly benefit 28,238 people (48.3 percent women), bring 6,628 hectares of land under climate resilience, strengthen climate adaptation in 36 policies or frameworks, train 3,754 people (49.8 percent women), and result in 65 private sector enterprises engaged in climate change adaptation and resilience action.

Sectoral Distribution




Figure 10: Sectoral Distribution of SCCF Projects since Inception

52. Each SCCF project focusses on one or more sectors. Figure 10 provides a breakdown of the cumulative sectoral focus on all SCCF projects since inception. Water, agriculture, and climate

information are the sectors with the greatest focus among all SCCF projects, followed by the sector of nature-based solutions.

MULTI-TRUST FUND PROJECTS (MTFs)

- 53. To date, there have been a total of 44 projects and six programmatic approaches that draw resources from multiple trust funds involving the LDCF and/or SCCF. Of these 44 MTF projects, 11 draw resources from both the LDCF and SCCF, 23 draw from the LDCF and GEF Trust Fund, and 8 draw from the SCCF and GEF Trust Fund.
- 54. The ability to advance integration and mainstreaming of adaptation with support from multiple trust funds is a unique and positive feature of the GEF, as this supports integration and seek synergy across different climate and global environmental dimensions. The GEF Secretariat will continue its efforts to facilitate such programming as appropriate, taking into consideration national needs, opportunities for systemic impact, and programming priorities.

IMPLEMENTATION OF GEF-8 STRATEGY ON ADAPTATION TO CLIMATE CHANGE: DEDICATED PROGRAMS

55. The GEF-8 Programming Strategy includes a new initiative called the Dedicated Programs, a corporate program that provides targeted support for communications and visibility

enhancement, outreach and capacity support for country planning and programming with a focus on enabling access to finance, and organizational learning and coordination.

- 56. Significant progress during this reporting period on the Dedicated Programs has been made through the series of regional workshops to enhance the knowledge of countries for programming of their LDCF resources during the GEF-8 period. These workshops have also provided opportunities for increased engagement of the GEF Secretariat directly with Council members and alternates, national GEF Operational Focal Points (OFPs), specialists focused on climate adaptation programming and implementation, civil society organizations (CSOs), and GEF Agencies. During this reporting period, three sub regional workshops were held involving 26 LDCs, four of which are SIDS. A fourth workshop was held shortly after this reporting period involving an additional 17 LDCs.
- 57. Visibility and communications related actions have also progressed during this reporting period. Several of the communications efforts were associated with the workshops, while others were focused on the LDCF/SCCF objectives and impact more broadly. Organizational learning and coordination have also been advanced during this reporting period, particularly on identification of key themes, learning topics, and partners, including in association with the workshops.

Dedicated Program I. Communications and Visibility Enhancements

- 58. A communications strategy was prepared during the reporting period, with the goal of enhancing the profile and visibility of the LDCF and SCCF, in accordance with the guidance provided by Council and aligned with the GEF-8 Programming Strategy on Adaptation to Climate Change. The strategy was approved by senior management of the GEF Secretariat and is being used to guide ongoing communications activities.
- 59. The strategy defines actions to strengthen the identity of the LDCF/ SCCF, within the context of ongoing communication activities taking place. It confirmed that, while it is necessary to strengthen awareness and understanding about these two trust funds managed by the GEF, this needs to be done as part of continued efforts to promote the GEF externally as a family of funds. This requires multifaceted messaging directed at strengthening perceptions of the LDCF and SCCF as important contributors to global action on climate change adaptation, while at the same time emphasizing the growing importance of climate adaptation and resilience within the GEF's broader mandate.
- 60. The strategy defines key messaging for the LDCF/SCCF. Key messages for the LDCF include awareness of dedicated support to LDCs. Key messages for the SCCF include showing how it has been redesigned to include two targeted funding windows which promote technology transfer, innovation, and private sector engagement, in addition to the other window which now acts as the only dedicated multilateral finance source focused directly on the climate changed adaptation priorities of SIDS.

- 61. A major goal of communication activities during this reporting period has been on supporting outreach and capacity support for LDCs and SIDS planning and programming, which is another key element of the GEF-8 Programming Strategy on Adaptation to Climate Change.
- 62. Introductory videos on the LDCF and SCCF in English, French, and Spanish were completed and profiled during this reporting period.⁷³ ⁷⁴ The full set of communications products profiling the LDCF and SCCF, as well as relevant projects and partners, are available on the GEF website.⁷⁵
- 63. Feature stories were published on the GEF website during the reporting period, which provided extensive coverage of the three regional programming and strategy workshops, held respectively in Senegal (17 African LDCs)⁷⁶, Cambodia (five Asian LDCs)⁷⁷, Solomon Islands (four Pacific LDCs)⁷⁸, and Ethiopia (17 African LDCs).⁷⁹ The articles featured quotes by leading government representatives in each of the host countries as well as by the GEF CEO and a leading representative of the UNFCCC. Each of the articles emphasized the importance the LDCF plays in helping LDCs in each of the regions address their adaptation needs, showed how GEF Secretariat staff provided guidance during the workshops on how to apply for LDCF funds, and indicated knowledge sharing about practical learnings from adaptation projects gained through field trips during each workshop. The publication of GEF social media posts linking to the articles helped to increase the reach of information dissemination. The three articles also formed the main part of a new section in the monthly GEF newsletter distributed in October focusing on LDCF/SCCF news.
- 64. Reporting on the GEF website about the 34th LDCF/SCCF Council meeting in June 2023 was crafted to match this messaging by highlighting how Cape Verde was the first country to receive funding under the SCCF's dedicated SIDS funding window, as one of the six LDCF/SCCF projects approved during the meeting.⁸⁰
- 65. The communications strategy also identified the use of thought leadership articles as a useful way to increase the profile and visibility of the two funds. A feature article featuring the CEO of FinDev Canada was published on the GEF website in September 2023 as a pilot in a new thought leadership series to promote the SCCF's window supporting technology transfer, innovation, and private sector engagement. ⁸¹Thought leaders have been identified for upcoming articles on innovation, technology, and private sector engagement, including partners in the Challenge Program for Adaptation Innovation and other LDCF/SCCF supported projects.

66. In addition, a printable eight-page publication providing information about both funds' contribution to climate adaptation was published on the GEF website. 82 The regularly updated brochure is designed as an accessible overview of both funds, as well as a supporting communication product for international bilateral meetings and events with the involvement of the GEF CEO and the Secretariat.

Dedicated Program II. Outreach and Capacity Support for LDCF and SIDS Planning and Programming

- 67. Significant progress was made during this reporting period under the Dedicated Program on "Outreach and Capacity Support for LDC and SIDS Planning and Programming". Of the series of regional programming workshops envisioned for LDCs and SIDS during GEF-8, three took place during the reporting period as discussed below, and another was in advanced stages of preparation.⁸³
- 68. The three regional adaptation programming and strategy workshops were held for a total of 26 countries, as follows:
 - The workshop for Francophone LDCs, hosted by the government of Senegal, was held from April 24-27, 2023, in Dakar, Senegal. It was attended by more than 100 participants involving 17 LDCs.⁸⁴
 - The workshop for Asian LDCs, hosted by the Kingdom of Cambodia, was held from September 19-22, 2023, in Seam Reap, Cambodia. It was attended by more than 60 participants involving five LDCs.⁸⁵
 - The workshop for Pacific Island LDCs, hosted by Solomon Islands, was held from September 26-29, 2023, in Honiara, Solomon Islands. It was attended by more than 50 participants involving four LDCs.⁸⁶
- 69. The overarching objective of the workshops is to enhance the knowledge of countries on LDCF programming, and more specifically, strengthen capacity of participants on climate change adaptation, planning, and programming projects for LDCF funding in the GEF-8 period. Participants included Council members and alternates for the relevant GEF constituencies, GEF


OFPs, UNFCCC national focal points, climate adaptation experts from various ministries and national institutions, civil society organization (CSO) representatives, and GEF Agencies. Through the workshop, participants' skills and knowledge were strengthened in designing and managing the implementation of their national adaptation priority needs, while enhancing access to adaptation finance and enable coordinated programming across various funding sources. The workshops were delivered through interactive sessions including videos, PowerPoint presentations, online surveys, and project concept brainstorming sessions that helped participants gain insights on the entire project development process.

- 70. Importantly, the workshop held in Senegal for French speaking African countries was delivered in French. All relevant materials, including presentation content, brochure, introductory videos, and other materials were also prepared and delivered in French.
- 71. An important feature of this workshop series is the active engagement of Council Members and Alternate Council members, including their moderating and presenting on key topics. For example, specific sessions were held during the workshops with the engagement of Council members and alternates on governance arrangements of the LDCF/SCCF, representation of countries, as well as on the role of the Council in reviewing and approving projects.
- 72. Participants shared learning from current and previous LDCF projects, including through learning stations that showcased projects in Dakar, Cambodia and Solomon Islands and provided participants to reflect and share experiences from other projects, highlighting achievements, challenges, and sustainability of project interventions. The workshops included key topics such as requirements for accessing LDCF/SCCF finance, the project cycle, designing for impact, strengthening the scientific basis of project concepts coordination with GCF programming, and other key topics. The Chair of the LDC Group under the UN Climate process also shared insights on the adaptation landscape.
- 73. Participants in the three workshops provided their assessment of the value of the convening and shared their interests in themes for further learning. Figure 11 illustrates positive feedback from participants on the value of the workshop. This figure shows participant's assessment on the level of value of the workshops for a set of aspects, from a scale of one to four, with four referring extremely valuable and zero referring to not valuable at all. Furthermore, in the agenda item on matters related to least developed countries, the 59th session of the UNFCCC Subsidiary Body for Implementation expressed appreciation to the GEF for organizing these workshops.⁸⁷




Figure 12: Participants' Interest in Key Themes for Further Learning⁸⁹

74. Participants in the workshops also indicated their interests in key themes further learning, as indicated in figure 12. When asked to select three themes that interest them from a set of size defined themes, participants across all workshops indicated nature-based solutions as a priority the most often (75.7 percent), followed by climate adaptation investment plan development (66.0 percent), and climate resilient agriculture/livestock (57.7 percent). Examples of additional themes highlighted by several participants as being of interest that are not indicated in Figure 12 included innovative financing models, digital services for climate resilient food systems, traditional knowledge for climate adaptation, inclusive finance, microlending, and climate smart coastal infrastructure.

Dedicated Program III. Organizational Learning and Coordination

75. With approximately 487 approved projects, many of which have been completed or are under implementation, the LDCF/SCCF portfolios provide an invaluable resource of climate change adaptation experiences and learning. In the GEF-8 period, the Secretariat will enhance portfolio- and partnership-oriented learning. The objective of this dedicated program is to enable the fund- and portfolio-level learning by creating, acquiring, and sharing knowledge and insights, with a strong focus on projects in the field. This learning gained will drive ongoing design and performance improvements of the LDCF and SCCF.

76. The definition of learning themes may draw from consultations that took place during the process of developing the GEF-8 LDCF/SCCF Programming Strategies, as well as the regional workshop series as part of Dedicated Program 2, including those indicated in Figure 12 above. The learning themes are also being informed through implementation of relevant projects supported by the LDCF and SCCF that have a strong focus on learning and knowledge sharing, including but not limited to the recently approved project described below in paragraph 83. A small technical advisory group is being formed to sharpen and identify specific opportunities for each of the learning themes, in collaboration with thought leaders in the field of climate change adaptation.

77. During this reporting period, GEF OFPs, UNFCC national focal points, other country representatives, and thematic technical specialists provided specific reflections on priorities for learning focus areas through regional workshops as part of Delivery Program II outlined above,

and other forums. Learning topics identified will serve as input to the advisory group in defining learning focus areas.

- 78. Learning focus areas may include, but not limited to: national climate adaptation investment plan development; policy coherence for climate adaptation and resilience; climate adaptation impact measures and monitoring; nature-based solutions; early warning and climate information systems; information technology for climate resilient food systems; climate resilience of energy production, transmission, and storage; gender considerations for climate adaptation and resilience; locally-led adaptation; climate resilience debt swaps; climate resilience impact bonds, blended finance for investment funds to catalyze climate adaptation and resilience; microfinance for localized climate adaptation and resilience; and climate resilience insurance.
- 79. Learning focus areas will be further determined based on criteria such as importance in GEF-8 period, significance and urgency of knowledge gaps, and potential areas of importance looking into GEF-9 period. Learning and knowledge sharing activities will be carried out with a strong view to enabling south-south learning.
- 80. Findings will be shared through white papers, blogs, journal articles, regional workshops, and technical clinics through Dedicated Program 2, as well as UNFCCC and other global and regional fora, with close collaboration and support from the Dedicated Program 1 on Communications and Visibility Enhancement. Learning and knowledge sharing activities will be carried out in such a way to enable south-south learning.

CHALLENGE PROGRAM FOR ADAPTATION INNOVATION

- 81. The Challenge Program for Adaptation Innovation was launched in 2019, in alignment with the approved adaptation programming strategy for GEF-7. The objective of this program is to catalyze innovation to harness the power of private sector actors for achieving adaptation results. The Challenge Program aims to test and validate potentially scalable, bankable, or otherwise fundable investment approaches, business models, partnerships, and technologies. The Challenge Program for Adaptation Innovation has been successful in attracting and engaging a range of new partners with whom the GEF had not yet been able to directly partner with through conventional programming.
- 82. Of the 19 winning projects that were invited to partner with GEF Agencies in submitting projects, 18 had been fully CEO approved at the end of this reporting period, consistent with GEF standard policies and procedures. Further, all 19 had been CEO Approved at the time of publication of this report.
- 83. A project that approved by the LDCF/SCCF Council in the June 2023 Work Program, titled Amplifying the Impact of the GEF Challenge Program for Adaptation Innovation through Learning and Knowledge Management was also fully CEO approved shortly after this reporting period, and

prior to the time of publication of this report. 90 This project will strengthen innovation and the role of the private sector in accelerating climate adaptation innovation through learning and knowledge management. Learning needs and opportunities identified and advanced through this project will complement activities of Dedicated Program 3 on Organizational Learning and Coordination.

84. The GEF-8 Strategy for Climate Change Adaptation calls for a four-fold increase in LDCF and SCCF support to climate adaptation innovation and private sector engagement through this challenge program up to \$80.00 million, to be financed equally by the LDCF and SCCF, subject to availability of resources.

THE INCLUSIVE GEF ASSEMBLY CHALLENGE PROGRAM⁹¹

- 85. The Inclusive GEF Assembly Challenge Program announced and recognized exemplary local initiatives at the Seventh GEF Assembly held in Vancouver, Canada, with the engagement of GEF Constituencies and with support from the Government of Canada. The program is an initiative funded by the SCCF and LDCF to help strengthen the inclusive nature of the Seventh GEF Assembly, as well as to demonstrate the GEF's commitment to work with non-state actors in advancing its mission for healthy planet and healthy people. The objective of this program was to catalyze inclusive and innovative on-the-ground action, implemented by a wide range of partners, including community based/civil society organizations in delivering inclusive climate resilience benefits for people and ecosystems, and advance the whole-of-society approach.
- 86. In total, 23 civil society organizations were selected as winners, out of nearly 600 applications. The selection panel comprised members of the GEF CSO Network, Scientific and Technical Advisory Panel, Indigenous Peoples' Advisory Group, and Gender Partnership, as well as youth representatives linked to international environmental Conventions.
- 87. Each winner will receive a grant of up to \$100,000, as well as access to networking, training, and knowledge exchange opportunities. The winners include a project that is drawing on the Maasai peoples' indigenous knowledge for climate resilience in Tanzania; an effort to mobilize rural youth in Costa Rica to preserve biodiversity; activities to bring together women and girls to protect coastlines in Antigua and Barbuda; and a project aiming to empower marginalized and vulnerable groups in Thailand to adapt to climate change.

88. The tables presented in this section provide an analysis on contribution levels and diversification, efficiency of cost structure, and visibility of the LDCF and the SCCF in FY23, from July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023.

89. The number of page views for adaption, LDCF, and SCCF increased to a total of 32,388 in FY23, from 22,956 in FY22, which represents an increase of 41.1 percent. With regards to the SCCF specifically, it is noteworthy that although this trust fund has been resource constrained in recent years, it received nearly the same amount of media attention as was the case for LDCF.
