






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


Distribution of Resources by Focal Area

GEF-8 Second Call for Proposals

- 3 from MDB (including DBSA) 1 from NGO (FUNBIO)
- 2 projects include innovative capital markets solutions for biodiversity and conservation
- 3 projects target SMEs as main beneficiaries of the financing
- Over 60% of the co-financing is from the private sector






