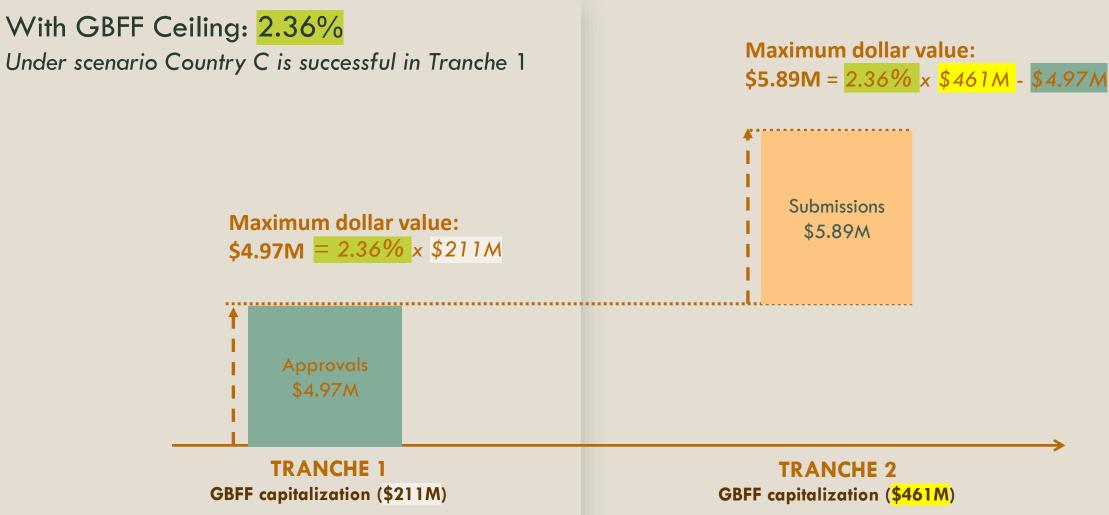

- 4. Level of policy coherence and coordination across multiple ministries, agencies, the private sector and civil society
- 5. Balance amongst regions
- 6. Mobilization of private sector and philanthropies' resources
- 7. Engagement with and support to IPLCs

SUBMISSION

- Secretariat opens a submission window
- Agencies submit PPG requests
 within countryspecific ceilings

 Secretariat reviews all eligible PPG requests based on the agreed 7 selection criteria

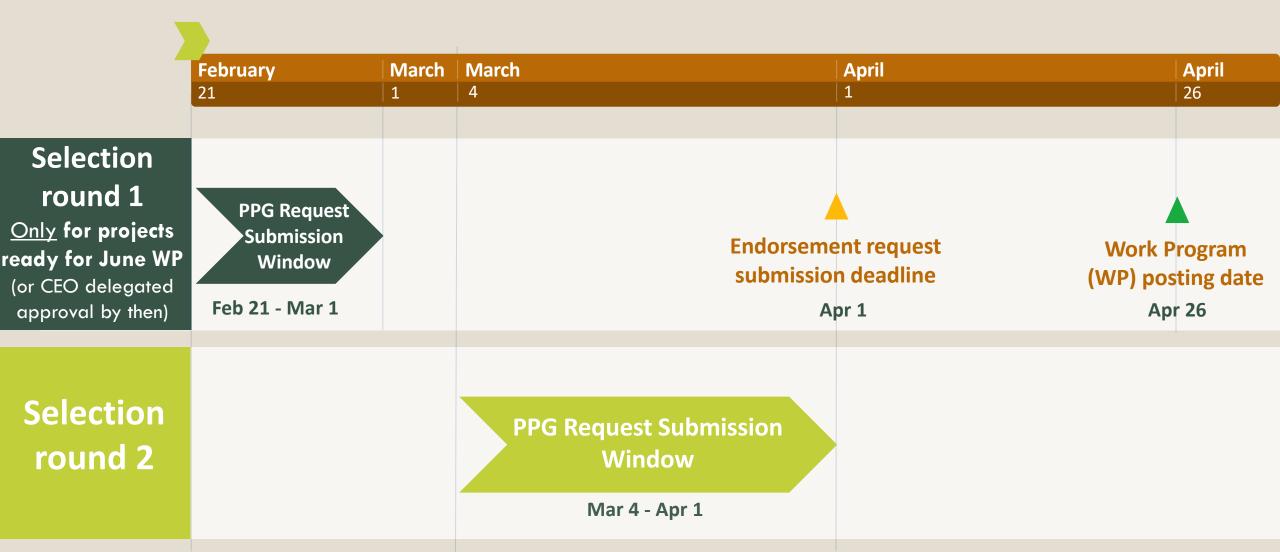
REVIEW

CEO APPROVAL

- Based on the review, resource availability and the three portfoliolevel targets, the CEO approves all or a subset of the submitted PPG requests
- Resources for the full project value set aside upon PPG approval

THREE PORTFOLIO-LEVEL TARGETS

- 36%+3% allocated to SIDS/LDCs
- A full 25% to be programmed through IFIs
- Aspirational share of 20% by 2030 to support actions by IPLCs

Unable to submit CEO Endorsement Request 9 months after PPG approval ? OFP (for national projects) or Agency (for Global/ Regional projects) submits a Request for Extension invoking force majeure to the GEF CEO prior to the deadline (max. 3 months) Unable to start implementation 12 months after CEO Endorsement?

Project cancelled.

Subject to funds availability, the Agency may resubmit the project for CEO Endorsement within one year from the effective date of cancellation
