
+ What is the Scientific and Technical Advisory Panel (STAP)?



Independent Advisory Body to the GEF

- Provide ‘objective, strategic and technical advice on GEF policies, strategies, programs and projects.’
- Established by the GEF instrument, in consultation with UNDP and the World Bank, in 1994, and is administered by the United Nations Environment Program (UNEP).
- Comprised of a (global) Panel of Experts and the STAP Secretariat in Washington.

What Does STAP Do?

- Advises on **focal areas** as well as **cross-cutting thematic areas**, such as adaptation to climate change and sustainable forest management.
- Scans for **emerging global environmental issues** (e.g. black carbon, marine debris, green chemistry, etc.).
- In GEF-6, STAP is supporting the GEF Partnership on Integrated Approach Pilots and efforts to improve Knowledge Management at the GEF.





+ STAP provides operational advice on projects and programs

- Collaborate with the **GEF Independent Evaluation Office (IEO)** and **Implementing Agencies**.

Recent STAP Advisory Products






Overview of the STAP project proposals (PIF) screening process

- STAP screens all full-size GEF projects at entry into the GEF project cycle.
- Intended to provide an assessment to the GEF Council regarding the scientific and technical soundness of each major proposal.
- Three possible outcomes:
 - CONCUR
 - MINOR ISSUES TO BE CONSIDERED
 - MAJOR ISSUES TO BE CONSIDERED
