Introduction

1. In line with the decision in November 2010 by the GEF Council to approve document GEF/C.39/10, *Enhancing the Engagement of Civil Society Organizations in the Operations of the GEF*, the Council requested the GEF Secretariat to work with countries, Agencies, the GEF NGO Network and other partners to implement the proposed activities through regular GEF operations.
2. One element of the proposed activities related to enhancing the feedback to the council on the work of the GEF NGO Network was the proposal for an annual report for information to the Council at its Fall session describing its overall activities of the GEF NGO Network, with specific sections dedicated to the work carried out by its Central Focal Point, Regional Focal Points and Indigenous Peoples Focal Points.
3. The GEF NGO Network is an independent Network of civil society organizations (CSOs) established in 1995 to facilitate civil society inputs to GEF processes. The GEF-NGO Network comprises nearly 450 member organizations with experience and expertise in GEFs areas of work from all regions around the world. It is governed by a global Coordination Committee composed of representatives of elected Regional Focal Point organisations from 15 geographic regions and three Indigenous Peoples Focal Points from Asia, Africa and Latin America. The day-to-day work of the Network is coordinated by a Central Focal Point (CFP) elected from among the Coordination Committee members. It has been recognized by the GEF Council and GEF Secretariat as a key entity in the work of the GEF.
4. The following information document provides the progress made in the period July 2010-June 2011 by the GEF NGO Network.

Network Structure and Function

5. The basic Network structure was established in the late 1990s and consolidated through development and adoption of a series of guidelines and rules and procedures the most recent of which was adopted in June 2010 [add web link]. The Regional Focal Points (RFPs) are elected for four year terms from among the members in 15 different geographical regions (see **Annex 1**). The regional focal points are responsible for stimulating interest in GEF among CSOs in their regions and facilitating engagement of CSOs in GEF programmes and activities. Indigenous Peoples Focal Points (IPFPs) are selected through consultation among members of key Indigenous Peoples networks in three regions – Asia, Africa and Latin America. They also serve four year terms. The RFPs and IPFPs elect from among their number one organization to serve as the Central Focal Point (CFP) to act as secretariat and coordinate the day to day operations of the Network. The current list of RFPs, IPFPs and CFP is in **Annex 2**. In response to the GEF5 reforms the Network is in the process of enhancing its presence at the

country level through the designation of country contact points – especially in countries with significant numbers of members as well as high GEF fund allocation. All these Network functions are undertaken on a voluntary basis by the organizations and individuals involved.

6. The Current Rules and Procedures of the Network set out the main procedures for Network functioning including membership, elections, representation, decision making and fund management. The network has its own complaints procedure to address any concerns from member organizations.
7. The Coordination Committee meets twice a year immediately before the GEF Council CSO consultation meetings prior to the Council. The committee oversees the work of the network, approves budgets, strategies and workplans for the network operations. It also explores strategies to enhance the effectiveness of the Networks work to enhance civil society input to GEF. The Committee has established four Sub committees to address Governance, membership and elections; Outreach and communication; Strategy and planning; and Linkage with GEF-related conventions. Task forces are established from time to time to address key issues. In the past year, task forces have been established to oversee regional elections and develop inputs to a GEF Policy on Indigenous peoples.

Organization and participation in GEF Related meetings

GEF Council – CSO Consultations

8. The GEF NGO Network plays a key role in the organization of GEF Council – CSO Consultations immediately prior to the GEF Council meetings in Washington DC. These bring together representatives of member CSOs, GEF Council members, GEF Agencies, GEF related Conventions and GEF Secretariat. The meetings provide a forum for key issues of concern to civil society to be discussed with the GEF Council members, agency representatives and other stakeholders.
9. GEF Council-Civil Society consultations were organized by the Network prior to the 39th GEF Council meeting in November 2010 and the 40th GEF Council in May 2011. Each meeting was attended by nearly 100 people from a broad range of stakeholders. The GEF CEO participated in a one hour dialogue session in each meeting providing an opportunity for CSOs to learn first-hand of key GEF initiatives and challenges.
10. The focus of the Network at the November 2010 consultation was on the key issues in enhancing civil society participation in GEF and enhancing the engagement of civil society in GEF related conventions. Presentations by the Executive Secretary of CBD on key results of the successful CBD COP10 and the challenges to implement the New Strategic plan were balanced with a debate on the future of climate financing following the Copenhagen COP15. Focus was also placed on strengthening the role of Indigenous peoples in working with GEF.

11. At the consultation prior to the 40th Council meeting, a major focus was placed on the issue of indigenous people in GEF with participation of representatives from the UN permanent Forum on indigenous peoples which was meeting at the same time in New York. The GEF CEO committed in the meeting to the development of a GEF Policy on Indigenous peoples to be considered at the GEF Council in June 2012. Another major focus was on the issue of the proposed Policy on Environmental and Social Safeguards. Serious concerns were raised by civil society in this meeting which contributed to subsequent changes in the Provisional policy adopted at the subsequent council meeting as well as an agreement to provide a further three months for comments on the policy. In view of the 20th Anniversary of the GEF, a session on the future of GEF and civil society was held which concluded that civil society was going to be an increasingly important partner for all GEF activities and the hope that GEF in the future would direct more resources to CSOs to safeguard the global environment. GEF Regional meeting and Expanded Constituency Workshops

12. In 2010 the Network regional Focal points attended Regional meetings of GEF Focal points organised under the Country Support Programme in the following regions: Asia, Latin America and Southern Africa. In 2011 the new Extended Constituency Workshops (ECW) were initiated where one CSO from each country was invited to a workshop with GEF and Convention Focal Points. Between January to June 2011, the Network RFPs and members attended ECW meetings in Central Africa Region, Caribbean Islands, Asia, South America and Central America. During the workshops, the RFP played an important role in facilitating and organizing CSO's side events to familiarize them with GEF and Network activities. A list of meetings attended by Network focal points in the period is given in **Annex 3**.

Input to GEF Policy Making

13. The Network contributed to GEF Policy making through providing inputs to the development of papers for the GEF Council, making and presenting position papers on Council documents and through interventions on related agenda items in the Council meetings. In relation to the 39th and 40th Council meetings, the Network provided specific input into the following 3 working papers:

The Network input to the development of Paper 2 was very significant. Although not all items raised by the Network were incorporated in the draft council paper, the interaction with the Secretariat led to many issues important for civil society be included.

14. The Network presented a number of position papers and made associated statements in relation to GEF Council working papers at the respective GEF Council as listed below.

15. Another clear result of Network intervention was in relation to the GEF Policy on Environmental and Social Safeguards which as mentioned above was modified to incorporate many of the suggestions from the Network which were also shared with many council members.

16. During the year the Network discussed a number of measures to strengthen the partnership of the civil society with GEF. Among the key actions proposed was the review and updating of the GEF Public Involvement Policy (originally adopted in 1996) to enhance the effectiveness of its implementation and preparation of specific guidelines to operationalise the Policy in the context of the GEF 5 Reforms. The Network also pushed for the development of a GEF Policy on indigenous peoples which was agreed in principle by the GEF secretariat in May 2011. The network also submitted a proposal for streamlined procedures and arrangements for the organization of CSO consultations and input to GEF Council, Assembly and regional meetings.

Outreach and communication

17. The Network within the constraints of its limited resources was active during the year in promoting the work of GEF and the Network to its members and other organizations. Electronic mailing groups were extensively used at regional and global level to disseminate information to members. Currently there are 22 mailing lists - for each of the 4 sub-committees and the Coordination Committee, the 15 regions, 1 global and 1 general. The Network maintained and enhanced its website (www.gefngo.org) as a tool for information dissemination. Since the website has been functional, it has attracted a total of 22,764 visitors (up till June 2011). The

number of visitors per month has steadily increased over the past year with the monthly average now topping 1000 visitors.

18. During the period July 2010 - June 2011, the GEF NGO Network further enhanced efforts to engage civil society in the work of GEF. At the global and regional level this was facilitated through organization of a range of events and dialogues and operation of various outreach mechanisms. Civil society organizations also gave enhanced input to the work of GEF through input to the GEF Council, regional consultations, Expanded Constituent Workshops (ECW) as well as directly at the national and local levels.
19. The Network also contributed to GEF publications – namely The A to Z of the GEF : A Guide to the Global Environment Facility for Civil Society Organizations in April 2011.

Membership Development

20. Although since 1996 the GEF NGO Network has coordinated the activities of all the CSOs accredited to GEF – the formal accreditation and database administration was undertaken by the GEF secretariat. In November 2008, the GEF Council decided that accreditation of CSOs by the GEF Secretariat would be replaced by membership in the GEF NGO Network and that the Network would thus take over the administration of the records of all CSOs accredited since 1996. This was done due to the belief that the Network would be in a better position to review applications for membership and also to maintain and engage existing members. The formal transfer of the membership database to the Network only took place in March 2010 when records of 398 organizations judged by GEFSEC to be active accredited CSOs were transferred to the Network.. In June 2010, the Network launched an on-line membership application system which ensures that each application is immediately acknowledged and also sent to the Network Membership Officer. for processing. After screening by the membership officer, applicants are reviewed by respective RFPs or IPFPs (for indigenous Peoples’ organizations) before being reviewed and approved by the Coordination Committee. In order to be accepted as members, organizations must meet basic criteria based on those adopted by the GEF Council in 1996 for accreditation of CSOs to GEF.
21. The membership of the Network has been growing steadily since June 2010. As of June 2011, there were 427 members in the Network compared to 398 members transferred to the Network by the GEF Secretariat. Membership promotion was undertaken at global, regional and local levels through the RFP, international meetings, for example, the dialogue session with GEF CEO during the convention meeting, and through website. The current (to 10 October 2011) list of member organizations (448) is given in **Annex 4**.

Elections of RFPs

22. During this reporting period, election of new RFPs was successfully undertaken for seven out of the 15 regions namely: Western and Central Africa, Southern Africa, Europe, Eastern Europe and Central Asia, Northern America, SE Asia and NE Asia . The election process of the Regional Focal Points was successfully completed through an online voting system overseen by two Election Task Forces.

Strengthening of links between GEF and CSOs in Convention meetings

23. Building on an initiative started in 2009, dialogues were organized by the Network between CSOs attending Convention meetings and the \GEF CEO. In October 2010 a dialogue was organized between GEF and civil society organizations attending the CBD COP 10 in Nagoya. Subsequently a dialogue was also organized at the UNFCCC COP16 in Cancun in Mexico in December 2010. At these dialogues, face-to-face, interactive dialogues between the GEF CEO and senior CSO representatives took place which helped to enhance mutual understanding on the role of GEF and its evolving role in the conventions.

Work of the Network Focal Points

Regional Focal Points

24. At the regional level, activities were undertaken by the RFPs in their respective region to enhance the role of civil society in GEF activities and in promoting the Network. Among the key activities undertaken by RFPs in their regions were :
 - a. Dissemination of information about events, meetings, updates and comment pertaining to environment and GEF activities to CSOs in their respective regions.
 - b. Circulation of reports on achievements from GEF Council CSO consultations and the GEF Council
 - c. Soliciting and collating of inputs and comments from the constituency on Network position papers, GEF papers, etc.
 - d. Promote the Network through emails, website and meetings to encourage more local CSOs to be a part of the Network.
 - e. Sharing and dissemination of information on funding opportunities including SGP to CSOs.
 - f. Recommendation of participants from their region for participation in the GEF meetings, e.g. Council, Expanded Constituency Workshops (ECW) and other meetings.
 - g. Liaising with GEF operational Focal points in selected countries in their regions.
 - h. Participation in GEF Council Consultation meetings and GEF Council meetings and providing inputs to related position papers.
 - i. Participating in meetings of the Coordination Committee and relevant sub committees.
 - j. Organization of meetings of CSOs as appropriate at country or regional level (back to back with ECW meetings)

- k. Participation by some RFPs in selected convention related meetings (including CBD COP 10 and UNFCCC COP 16).

Indigenous Peoples Focal Points

25. The three Indigenous People's Focal Points were active during the year in a number of activities including:
- a. Dissemination of information about events, meetings, updates and comment pertaining to environment and GEF activities to Indigenous peoples' organizations and Networks in their respective regions.
 - b. Circulation of reports on achievements from GEF Council CSO consultations and the GEF Council to Indigenous People's organizations and Networks
 - c. Soliciting and collating of inputs and comments from Indigenous peoples on Network position papers, GEF papers, etc.
 - d. Promoting the Network through emails, website and meetings to encourage more indigenous Peoples' organizations to join the Network.
 - e. Sharing and dissemination of information on funding opportunities including SGP to Indigenous peoples organizations
 - f. Recommendation of participants from indigenous peoples' organizations for participation in the GEF meetings, e.g. Council, Expanded Constituency Workshops (ECW) and other meetings.
 - g. Participation in GEF Council-CSO Consultation meetings and GEF Council meetings and providing inputs to position papers on CSO engagement in GEF and Environmental Social Safeguards..
 - h. Participating in meetings of the Coordination Committee and relevant sub committees.
 - i. Participation in selected convention related meetings including g UNFCCC COP 16 and CBD COP 10.
 - j. Development of a proposal for preparation of an issues paper on GEF and Indigenous peoples to support the development of a GEF Policy on Indigenous peoples.

Central Focal Point

26. The Central Focal Point was actively involved in coordination of review of council papers, preparation of Network position papers, organizing preparatory and Council-CSO meetings and other GEF-related meetings and overall administration of the Network. Among the key activities were :
- a. Organizing the Coordination Committee meeting, Preparatory meetings and GEF Council – CSO Consultation meetings during the 39th and 40th Council meetings in November 2010 and May 2011 respectively.
 - b. Attended two convention meetings; CBD COP10 in Nagoya (Oct 2010) and UNFCCC COP16 in Cancun (Dec 2010). During both meetings, a special dialogue session between the GEF CEO and the CSOs was organized by the Network to discuss GEF contributions and CSOs engagement in the conventions.

- c. Outreach and communication with members to share information on GEF NGO Network and GEF activities including egroup and website operation and maintenance.
- d. Coordinating membership administration and promotion.
- e. Coordinating Preparation of Network policy and position Papers for GEF Council sessions.
- f. Managing funds and resources for the Network

Finance and Administration

27. Although the Network primarily works on a voluntary basis – it needs resources to cover the cost of specific activities and services including development and maintenance of the website and mailing lists, membership development and administration, attendance at GEF related meetings and workshops, development and dissemination of information and awareness materials,, consultation and regional and country levels. In 2009-2010 a grant of \$50,000 was received from the GEFSEC towards such costs. No grant was received by the Network from the GEF Secretariat in the period July 2010 to June 2011. However a small balance from the earlier grant supported low level activities in 2010. Lack of funds did reduce the level of Network activities in 2011. An additional grant of USD 50,000 was committed by the GEF Secretariat to the Network in June 2011 and received in end of July 2011. In line with its procedures for financial management, Network accounts are audited on a calendar year basis and the audit reports posted on the Network website.
28. During the year the Network also received support in terms of expenses for participation of CSOs in November 2010 and the May 2011 Council/CSO Consultation meetings. Co-financing was also provided by Network members for a number of activities through significant time input as well as costs for a number of participants in various meetings.

Key issues/concerns and recommendation

29. During the course of the year a number of concerns related to CSO engagement in GEF have been highlighted as follows

A. Pressing need to Review and update the GEF Public Involvement Policy

30. Following a special review session during the CSO Preparatory Meeting, on 13 November 2010, the Network highlighted during a special session of the GEF Council CSO Consultation on 14 November that GEF Public Involvement Policy (adopted in 1996) should be reviewed and updated. Over the past 14 years there have been many ways in which the role and modality of GEF and GEF entities have changed. In addition there has been broader recognition by many governments of the need to incorporate civil society into GEF processes. In the package of GEF 5 reforms there are many changes to the modality of GEF. As a result it is important the GEF Public Involvement Policy be revised to incorporate these various changes.

Recommendation: The 1996 GEF Public Involvement Policy should be reviewed and updated to enhance the effectiveness of its implementation and introduce new concepts and practices for public participation. In addition it was recommended that specific guidelines to operationalise the Policy in the context of the GEF 5 Reforms be prepared. It is recommended that such work take place through a participatory process in 2011-2012 to enable for consideration by the GEF Council in November 2012.

B. Need for a GEF Policy on indigenous peoples

31. The Network has been highlighting for several years the need for GEF to have a policy on Indigenous peoples. Many GEF projects related to biodiversity, land degradation and to some extent climate change are relevant to indigenous peoples. GEF has had a long history of engagement with indigenous peoples especially in relation to Biodiversity and also the SGP. The proposed GEF Policy on Minimum Standards for Environmental and Social Safeguards has touched on IP issues but is only setting minimum standards for partner agencies rather than any proactive policy to advise more positive engagement with Indigenous peoples in line with the GEF Public involvement and other policies. In line with the Paper endorsed by the Council in November 2010 on enhancing engagement of Civil society in GEF – the Indigenous Peoples’ Focal Points of the Network have been facilitating discussions at the last two council meetings and initiated development of an issues paper on GEF and Indigenous peoples.

Recommendation: Indigenous Peoples Focal Points of the Network will continue to work with other Indigenous Peoples networks and the GEF Secretariat in developing the proposed issues paper to provide input to the development of a policy paper by the Secretariat. It is hoped a formal council paper be developed on this matter by the secretariat for consideration by the June 2012 meeting.

C. Enhancing the procedures for the selection and travel arrangements for CSOs supported to attend GEF Council-CSO consultations

32. In line with the Decision of the GEF Council in 1995, the GEF NGO Network has been given clear responsibility for the selection of CSO representatives to receive travel support from GEF to participate in consultations associated with the Council meetings. This procedure has empowered the Network to select representatives in line with guidance from the Council to ensure a balance of regional representativeness and relevant expertise. The system of regional elections of focal points by members in the region has enabled consistent coordination and input and effective contribution to policy making. Additional resources made available by the Council since 2008 has allowed for additional representatives from each region as well as selection of persons with particular expertise or experience suited to the Council or consultation meeting agendas. However in order to ensure that visa and travel arrangements are made on time it has been necessary to make the selection of participants for support two months before the Council before the final agenda and papers are available. This has constrained the ability to effectively select additional participants directly related to the key agenda item and papers for the Council. Delaying the selection of people will enhance the problems with visas as well as increase travel expense due to escalating costs.

Recommendation: It is suggested that in future some flexibility is given to the Network to select some participants for sponsorship early – especially elected Regional or Indigenous Peoples Focal Points as well as some others selected on a geographic basis – so that visas and travel arrangements can be made early to ensure timely arrangements and reduction in travel costs. Secondly some portion of funds

could be allocated for the expenses of selected specialists who may be able to provide specific input to selected agenda items of the Consultation or Council meetings.

D. Adjustment of Selection procedure for CSO Participants in the GEF Assembly

33. The arrangements for the earlier GEF Assemblies have been similar to the Council with the GEF NGO Network selecting the CSO representatives to receive support to attend the CSO Forum held at the time of the Assembly. However for the almost recent Assembly in 2010 – selection of the CSO participants was made by the GEF Secretariat and not by the Network. This constrained the ability of the Network to select appropriate persons from some regions to contribute to the strategic discussions in the Forum. In addition problems with the travel service provider led to some travel arrangements being made at the last minute with high costs being incurred and other problems that prevented the participation of some selected persons.

Recommendation: For the next GEF Assembly the Network should take the same role in selection as is done for the Council consultations leading role in the selection of participants for the meeting and in addition selection and travel arrangements for most people should be made well in advance – but with some flexibility for adjustment with regard to selected speakers or persons for input into specific agenda items of the Assembly.

E. Enhancing the role of the Network in selecting participants for the ECW meetings

34. GEF has introduced the Expanded Constituency Workshops in 2011 as a new mechanism to facilitate enhanced learning and exchange among key stakeholders including civil society. The GEF NGO Network is very happy with this new development and the fact that one CSO per country is supported to attend each annual meeting in their respective regions. One key issue is the process to select the CSOs from the various countries. In the council decision on Enhancing engagement of CSOs in GEF adopted in November 2010 it was proposed that the respective Regional Focal Points of the GEF NGO Network would be directly involved in the facilitation of the selection process in their respective regions. However to date there appears to have been little or no consultation between the GEF Secretariat and the Network on the selection process. In addition some Regional Focal Points and also Indigenous Focal Points of the Network have not been selected for support to attend meetings. This has prevented the planned meetings between the RFPs and the selected CSOs from their region which was hoped would help enhance coordination and relations in the Region. Another issue is that in some cases there is a disparity between ECW country groups and GEF-NGO Network regions which has meant in some cases that the RFPs have not been able to attend meetings attended by a majority of the members in their constituency. It was also earlier envisaged that if the Voluntary fund was operational that CSOs could support additional participation or arrange back to back one day CSO meetings to advance GEF issues. Unfortunately (see below) that has not been possible.

Recommendation: A modified procedure for selection of the participants for the ECW meetings is adopted which involves both the GEFSEC and the Network in the

decision making and also helps to empower the network to maximize the value of the ECW meetings for Consultation and planning among GEF related CSOs at the regional level. Flexibility to facilitate the attendance of Network Focal points in relevant meetings should preferably be accommodated.

F. Operation of NGO Voluntary Fund

35. The GEF Council agreed in November 2008 to reestablish the Voluntary Fund to support the work of the GEF NGO Network. In Nov 2010, the Council reiterated the need to expedite the establishment of the fund and confirmed that the \$35,000 currently in the fund could be allocated to support Network activities. To date (October 2011) the Voluntary fund has yet to become operational. It was envisaged that this would be capitalized adequately to enable the Network to enhance its work of consultation and capacity building to enhance CSO engagement in GEF planning and implementation. The lack of financial resources to support the Network activity has been a major constraint to the Network in achieving its targets and has affected the credibility of the Network governance with some members.

Recommendation: The GEF Secretariat should operationalize the Voluntary Fund before the end of 2011 and encourage contributors from donors and channel resources to support the Network.
