# JOINT SUMMARY OF THE CHAIRS 47<sup>TH</sup> GEF COUNCIL MEETING OCTOBER 28 – 30, 2014

#### **OPENING OF THE MEETING**

1. The meeting was opened by Naoko Ishii, Chief Executive Officer/Chairperson of the Facility.

#### **ELECTION OF A CHAIRPERSON**

2. The Council elected Mr. Winston Thompson, the Council Member representing the Pacific Islands Constituency – Cook Islands, Fiji, Indonesia, Kiribati, Marshall Islands, Micronesia, Nauru, Niue, Palau, Papua New Guinea, Philippines, Samoa, Solomon Islands, Timor Leste, Tonga, Tuvalu, and Vanuatu.

#### ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

3. The Council adopted the provisional agenda set forth in document GEF/C.47/01/Rev.01.

#### REPORT OF THE CHAIRPERSON OF THE SCIENTIFIC AND TECHNICAL ADVISORY PANEL

4. Ms. Rosina Bierbaum, the Chairperson of the Scientific and Technical Advisory Panel, made a statement to the Council on the activities undertaken by the Panel.

#### **DECISIONS APPROVED**

5. The Council approved the following decisions with respect to the items on its agenda.

Decision on Agenda Item 4 Annual Monitoring Review (AMR) FY14: Part I

6. The Council, having reviewed GEF/C.47/04, *Annual Monitoring Review (AMR) FY14: Part I*, welcomes the overall finding that the GEF portfolio under implementation in FY14 performed satisfactorily across all focal areas. The Council welcomes the first disbursement analysis in the management effectiveness section.

Decision on Agenda Item 5 Results-based Management: Action Plan

7. The Council, having considered document GEF/C.47/05, *Results-based Management: Action Plan*, welcomed and approved the Action Plan. The Council requests the Secretariat to

report on progress in the implementation of the Action Plan at the next Council meeting in June 2015.

Decision on Agenda Item 6 GEF-6 Non-Grant Instrument Pilot and Updated Policy for Non-Grant Instruments

8. The Council, having reviewed document GEF/C.47/06, GEF-6 Non-Grant Instrument Pilot and Updated Policy for Non-Grant Instruments, approves the implementation modalities for the Non-Grant Instrument Pilot. The Council also approves the updated Policy on Non-Grant instruments presented in Annex 1 to this document with an effectiveness date of November 1, 2014. This new policy replaces and supersedes the policy of March 2008 set out in Council Document GEF/C.33/12 with the title "Operational Policies and guidance for the Use of Non-Grant Instruments."

Decision on Agenda Item 7 Improving the GEF Project Cycle

9. The Council, having reviewed document GEF/C.47/07, *Improving the GEF Project Cycle*, approves the following: (i) the updated Project Cancellation Policy as proposed in this paper and set out in Annex 2; and (ii) a revised Programmatic Approach modality as proposed in this paper. Furthermore, the Council requests the GEF Secretariat to provide at the 48th Council Meeting an analysis of the stock of projects approved before the 46th Council Meeting that are delayed more than 18 months from PIF/Council approval to CEO endorsement, and provide recommendations on how to address the issue, including possible modalities for inclusion in the updated Cancellation Policy.

Decision on Agenda Item 8 The Country Support Programme Implementation

- 10. The Council, having reviewed document GEF/C.47/08, *The Country Support Programme Implementation*, approved the proposal for the Secretariat to execute the Country Support Programme according to the procedures contained therein.
- 11. The Country Support Programme will be comprised of the following elements, funded with a total allocation from the GEF Trust Fund of \$23 million, allocated across each activity as specified below:
  - (a) Support for National Portfolio Formulation Exercises (NPFEs): \$2.4 million;
  - (b) Multi-stakeholder dialogues: \$2 million;
  - (c) GEF Workshops: \$12 million (ECWs 10 million; other workshops 2 million)
  - (d) Constituency Meetings: \$5 million;
  - (e) GEF Introduction Seminars: \$1.2million; and
  - (f) Pre-Council Meeting for Recipient Country Council Members/Alternates: 0.4 million
- 12. The Council directed the Trustee to set aside \$23 million in GEF Trust Fund resources for use by the Secretariat to fund these activities.

#### Decision on Agenda Item 9 Gender Equality Action Plan

- 13. The Council, having reviewed document GEF/C.47/09, *Gender Equality Action Plan* (*GEAP*), welcomes the action plan and approves its implementation, on the understanding that the relevant sections of the GEAP will be updated to clarify that the Secretariat will be creating a gender anchor function with gender specific expertise. The updated GEAP (GEF/C.47/09.Rev.01) will be posted on the GEF webpage section on Council Documents.
- 14. The Secretariat will bring in external gender specific expertise to help develop a long term solution to establish capacity in the Secretariat to meet the commitments made under this GEAP, including the creation and adequate staffing of the gender anchor function. The Secretariat will take these steps as a matter of high priority and provide an update on the progress at the 48<sup>th</sup> Council Meeting in June 2015.
- 15. The Council recognizes the close collaboration among the GEF Secretariat, GEF Agencies, related Multilateral Environment Agreements, civil society organizations, including women's groups, and other partners, in developing the action plan, and requests that this will be continued for its implementation.

Decision on Agenda Item 10 Relations with the Conventions and Other International Institutions

16. The Council, having considered document GEF/C.47/03, *Relations with the Conventions and Other International Institutions*, welcomed the report and requested the GEF Secretariat for future Council meetings to provide highlights of the key issues of relevance to the GEF that were discussed at the meetings of the conventions and the decisions taken thereon. Further the Council requested the Secretariat to include in future reports the table with responses to the guidance from the COPs of all conventions for which the GEF serves as a financial mechanism. Finally, the Council requested the GEF network to continue to work with recipient countries to reflect the guidance and national priorities in their GEF programming and activities.

Decision on Agenda Item 11 Progress Report on the Pilot Accreditation of GEF Project
Agencies & Timeline for Further Discussion of
Accreditation

- 17. The Council, having reviewed GEF/C.47/10, *Progress Report on the Pilot Accreditation of GEF Project Agencies & Timeline for Further Discussion of Accreditation*, notes the status of the Stage II reviews conducted by the Accreditation Panel to date and welcomes the Panel's decision to approve FUNBIO's progress from Stage II to Stage III.
- 18. The Council requests the Independent Evaluation Office to initiate an evaluation of the GEF accreditation process, and to present the findings of this evaluation to the Council at its 48<sup>th</sup> meeting in June 2015. The Council also requests the Secretariat to present a paper regarding possible directions on accreditation in the context of the evolving GEF business model, as a basis for discussion at the 49<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Council in November 2015.

19. The Council, having reviewed document GEF/ME/C.47/01, *Progress Report of the GEF Independent Evaluation Office Director*, takes note of the directions outlined in the document and authorizes the Director of the Independent Evaluation Office to further develop the work program with guidance from the Council and in consultation with GEF stakeholders for approval by the Council in its first meeting in 2015.

Decision on Agenda Item 14

Work Program

- 20. The Council, having reviewed document GEF/C.47/11, *Work Program*, approved the work program comprising fifteen (15) new project concepts, subject to comments made during the Council meeting and additional comments that may be submitted in writing to the Secretariat by November 6, 2014.
- 21. Total resources approved in this work program<sup>1</sup> amounted to \$190.74 million which include GEF project financing and Agency fees. The work program is comprised of the following Project Identification Forms (PIFs):

- 22. With respect to the following projects, the Council requested the Secretariat to arrange for Council members to receive draft final project documents and to transmit to the CEO within four weeks any concerns they may have prior to the CEO's endorsing the project document for final approval by the GEF Agency:
  - 1. **Tajikistan**: Conservation and Sustainable Use of Pamir Alay and Tian Shan Ecosystems for Snow Leopard Protection and Sustainable Community Livelihoods (UNDP)
  - 2. **China :** Upgrading of China SHP Capacity Project (UNIDO)
- 23. With respect to the PIFs approved as part of the work program, the Council finds that each of these PIFs (i) is consistent with the Instrument and GEF Policies and procedures, and (ii) may be endorsed by the CEO for final approval by the GEF Agency, provided that the final project documents fully incorporate and address the Council's and the STAP reviewer's comments on the work program, and that the CEO confirms that with these revisions, the project is consistent with the Instrument and GEF policies and procedures.
- 24. With respect to any PIF approved in this work program, the final project document will be posted on the GEF website for information after CEO endorsement. If there are major changes to the project scope and approach after PIF approval, the final project document will be posted on the web for Council review for four weeks prior to CEO considering endorsement.
- 25. The detailed funding decisions taken by the Council during this 47<sup>th</sup> session of the work program is part of the associated Annex 1 appended to this Joint Summary of the Chairs.
- 26. Pursuant to the draft decision circulated by mail on June 05, 2014, concerning projects with GEF ID numbers 5366 and 5739, the Council decided to postpone their consideration to a future date.

Decision on Agenda Item 16 Report of the Selection and Review Committee

- 27. The Council, having reviewed document GEF/C.47/12, *Report of the Selection and Review Committee (SRC):* 
  - (a) Takes note of the FY15 goals for the Director of the Independent Evaluation Office (IEO) and the GEF CEO and requests the SRC to present the performance evaluation of the IEO Director and the GEF CEO for the Council's review at its second meeting in 2015;
  - (b) Agrees with the SRC's positive assessment of the GEF CEO's FY14 performance and the recommendation to provide the GEF CEO with a "4" rating on the World Bank's 5-point scale, with an associated merit-based salary increase of 5.6%. The

Council requests the SRC to communicate this decision to the World Bank Human Resource Department.

Decision on Agenda Item 17 Other Business

28. The Council confirmed that it will hold its spring 2016 meeting during the week of June 06, 2016.
