**PROGRESS REPORT ON THE LEAST DEVELOPED COUNTRIES FUND  
AND THE SPECIAL CLIMATE CHANGE FUND**

**Recommended Council Decision**

The LDCF/SCCF Council, having reviewed document GEF/LDCF.SCCF.26/03 *Progress Report on the Least Developed Countries Fund and the Special Climate Change Fund*, welcomed the report and took note with appreciation of the progress made under the LDCF and the SCCF.

## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1. This report provides an update on the progress made in the operations of the Least Developed Countries Fund (LDCF) and the Special Climate Change Fund (SCCF) during the reporting period between November 1, 2018 – April 30, 2019. The financial status updates are as of March 31, 2019. As of March 31<sup>1</sup>, 2019, total cumulative pledges to the LDCF amounted to \$1,399.88 million. Of this amount, \$1,347.86 million, or approximately 96 percent, had been received.
2. Cumulative LDCF funding decisions by the Council and the CEO amounted to \$1,297.11 million for 271 projects. Resources available for new funding decisions amounted to \$ 112.06 million.<sup>2</sup>
3. The LDCF received approximately \$72 million in pledges during the Council meeting in December 2018. This includes contributions from Denmark, Finland, France, Ireland, the Netherlands, Switzerland, and the Walloon Region of Belgium, some of which were also announced during the 24<sup>th</sup> session of the Conference of the Parties (COP24). Switzerland made a pledge of \$3.3 million to the SCCF.<sup>3</sup>
4. Eleven projects requesting a total of US\$100.61 million from the LDCF and one project requesting a total of \$967,150 from the SCCF are being presented to the 26<sup>th</sup> LDCF/SCCF Council in June 2019 for approval as part of the Joint Work Program of the LDCF and SCCF.<sup>4</sup> The Work Program constitution follows the operational improvements agreed by the 24<sup>th</sup> LDCF/SCCF Council in June 2018, as stipulated in the GEF Programming Strategy on Adaptation to Climate Change for July 2018 to June 2022.<sup>5</sup>

6. As at April 30, 2019, 51 Least Developed Countries (LDCs) had accessed approximately \$12.20 million in support of the preparation of national adaptation programs of action (NAPA).

7. LDCF support toward national adaptation plan (NAP) processes totaled \$71.63 million as at April 30, 2019. This includes projects that explicitly seek to advance NAP processes in countries, in addition to technical assistance for tailored one-on-one support through the LDCF-financed NAP Global Support Program. Notably, several projects combined requests for funding to support NAP processes with requests to support concrete adaptation investments for NAPA implementation. Global projects amounting to \$13.69 million had been approved to support the NAP preparation process in LDCs, and the implementation of elements of the LDC work programme other than NAPAs.

8. For the LDCF, 156 out of 184 projects, excluding 53 NAPA preparation projects, provided an estimate of the number of direct beneficiaries at the time of the CEO endorsement or approval. These projects seek to directly reduce the vulnerability of over 21 million people. Furthermore, 83 LDCF projects have been endorsed or approved to support countries in their efforts to integrate climate change adaptation into 228 national development policies, plans and frameworks. The LDCF also assists countries in laying the groundwork for climate-resilient development through 82 projects that enable countries to strengthen their national climate information services network.

9. During this reporting period, as decided at the 24<sup>th</sup> LDCF/SCCF Council, the Secretariat continued to hold consultations with countries with technically cleared projects in the GEF-6 LDCF pipeline<sup>6</sup> to ascertain the viability of these projects in alignment with the respective countries' current national priorities for adaptation financing from the LDCF. More details regarding this process can be found in the section regarding consultations with countries with GEF-6 pipelined projects.

10. Based on the outcomes of consultations in the previous reporting period, four countries confirmed or revised their GEF-6 pipelined projects, which were approved as part of the first LDCF Work Program in December 2018. Ten countries (Benin, Djibouti, The Gambia, Ethiopia, Haiti, Lao PDR, Timor Leste, Togo, Uganda, and Zambia) carried out consultations during this reporting period. Most countries revised and re-submitted their proposals or developed new proposals that reflect current priorities. Among them, seven proposals were technically cleared by the deadline and were included in the June 2019 LDCF/SCCF Work Program. An updated summary of consultations held during the reporting period is included in this report.

11. As at March 31, 2019, cumulative pledges to the SCCF amounted to \$352.81 million. Of the total resources pledged, \$347.81 million or roughly 99 percent had been received. During the reporting period, no projects were approved for funding from the SCCF. One multi trust

fund (MTF) project requesting resources from the SCCF will be presented to the LDCF/SCCF Council as part of the June 2019 Work Program. Funds available to support Council or CEO decision amounted to \$15.59 million.<sup>7</sup>

12. As of March 31, 2019, cumulative SCCF funding decisions by the Council and the CEO amounted to \$353.87 million for 78 projects.

13. Fifty-two out of 76 SCCF projects provided an estimated number of direct beneficiaries at CEO endorsement or approval. These projects, with SCCF resources amounting to \$242.04 million, aim to directly reduce the vulnerability of nearly seven million people.

## INTRODUCTION

1. This report provides an update on progress made in the operations of the Least Developed Countries Fund (LDCF) and the Special Climate Change Fund (SCCF) since the inception of the two funds, as well as specific activities during the reporting period of November 2018 to April 30, 2019.

2. Table 1 below presents a summary of LDCF and SCCF operations, including total cumulative pledges, paid contributions, and project approvals.

## LEAST DEVELOPED COUNTRIES FUND

### Pledges and Contributions to the LDCF

3. As at March 31, 2019, cumulative pledges to the LDCF amounted to \$1,399.89 million from 25 donors. Of the resources pledged, \$1,347.86 million or about 96 percent had been

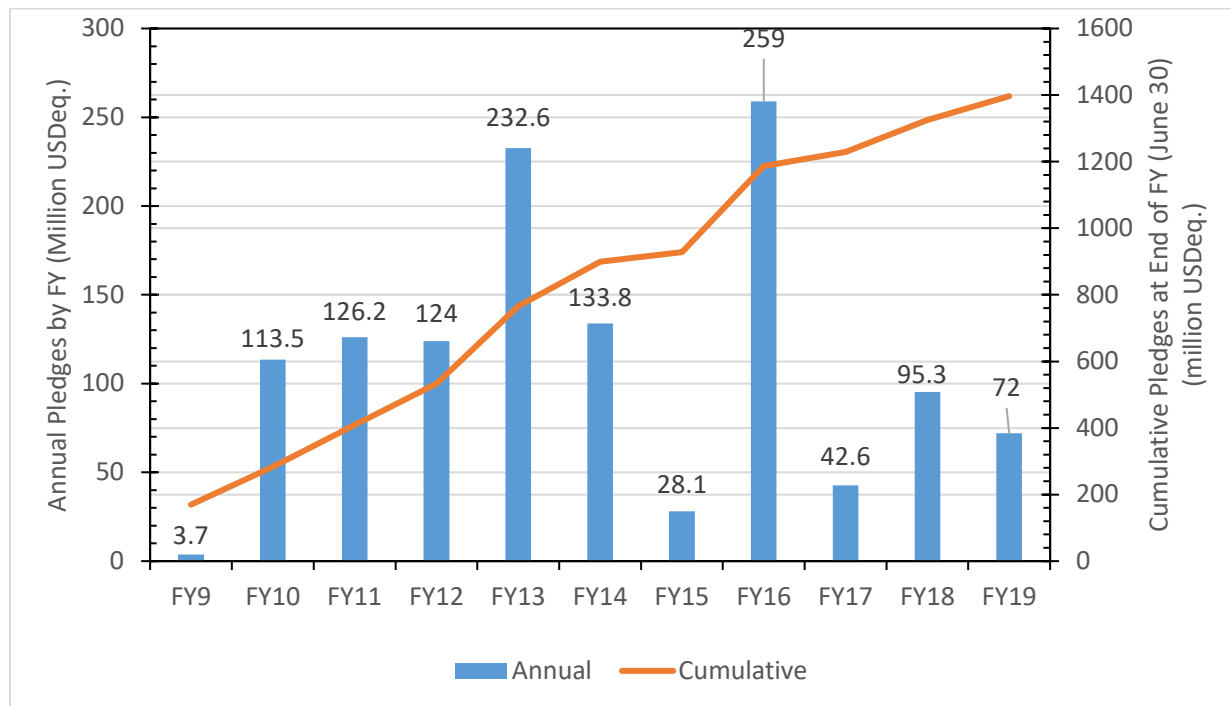

received. As of the same date, funds available for new funding decisions amounted to \$112.06 million.

4. Approximately \$72 million in pledges were made during the Council Meeting in December 2018. Pledges were announced by Denmark, Finland, France, Ireland, the Netherlands, Switzerland, and the Walloon Region of Belgium, some of which were also announced during COP24.

### Progress in LDCF Operations

5. As of April 30, 2019 the LDCF has provided \$12.20 million supporting the preparation of National Adaptation Programs of Action (NAPA).<sup>13</sup> South Sudan was the last country to submit its NAPA to the UNFCCC in 2017, bringing the total number of countries that had completed and submitted their NAPAs to 51.<sup>14</sup>

6. 50 LDCs had accessed a total of \$1,297.11 million for a total of 271 projects, including the preparation of NAPAs. Of the total, 217 projects were in support of NAPA implementation, national adaptation plan (NAP) process, and other elements of the LDC work programme (see Figure 2). These figures include three global projects with LDCF resources amounting to \$13.69 million approved to support the preparation of the NAP process in LDCs, and the implementation of elements of the LDC work programme other than NAPAs.

7. Eleven LDCF projects requesting \$100.61 million will be presented to the 26<sup>th</sup> LDCF/SCCF Council as part of the June 2019 LDCF/SCCF Work Program<sup>15</sup>. The Work Program constitution was based on the operational improvements agreed by the 24<sup>th</sup> LDCF/SCCF Council in June 2018 as part of the GEF Programming Strategy on Adaptation to Climate Change.<sup>16</sup>

8. In addition to financing the urgent and immediate adaptation needs of LDCs and the LDC work programme, the LDCF is also mandated to support the NAP process, which is an iterative and ongoing process encapsulating medium and long-term planning for adaptation<sup>17</sup>. As at April 30, 2019, total funding from the LDCF toward LDCs' NAP processes amounted to \$71.63 million. GEF support for NAPs in the GEF-7 period focuses on the implementation of NAP priorities as well as on additional analysis that may be needed to better align GEF proposals with the NAP framework.

9. These projects enable countries to move more effectively towards the integration of climate change adaptation considerations across key policies, plans, programs and decision-making processes, in line with COP guidance,<sup>18</sup> as well as a LDCF/SCCF Council decision to operationalize support towards NAP process.<sup>19</sup>

10. Each project approved during this reporting period or presented for the LDCF/SCCF Council consideration articulates its national priorities and alignment with the NAPA and NAP

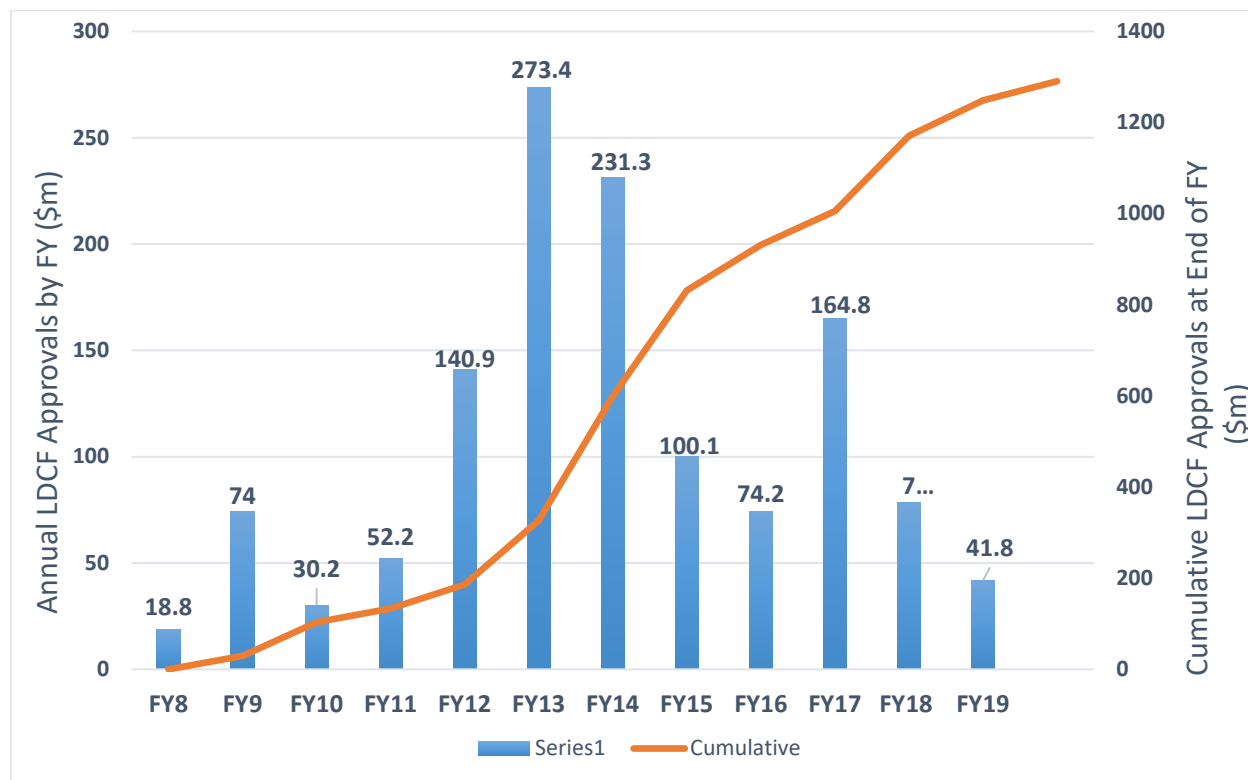

processes. All 47 LDCs currently eligible for LDCF support has had at least one NAPA implementation project approved under the LDCF.

### LDCF Resource Access for the GEF-7 Period

11. Currently, each LDC is eligible to access up to \$50 million from the LDCF (see Table 2). On July 1, 2018, an initial resource access cap was introduced allowing every LDC to draw up to \$10 million in LDCF resources toward the \$50 million ceiling accumulated during the GEF-7 period.<sup>20</sup> The rationale behind the introduction of the cap is to ensure more timely access to resources by as many LDCs as possible, while also maintaining the practice of equitable access.

12. Upon approval of the June 2019 LDCF/SCCF Work Program, 20 out of 47 LDCs, or 43 percent, have successfully accessed LDCF resources within 12 months of the new LDCF/SCCF strategy roll-out. This early result may be an indication that the operational improvements introduced in July 2018 are working to ensure more timely and equitable access to resources by

as many LDCs as possible. Efforts will be made to maintain and build on this momentum, with continued engagement of donors, LDCs, Agencies and partners.

## CEO Endorsements

13. During the reporting period, 11 projects were endorsed by the GEF CEO, totaling \$60.27 million in grant financing (see Table 3). In total, 237 projects, including 53 NAPA preparation projects, had been CEO endorsed or approved as of April 30, 2019.

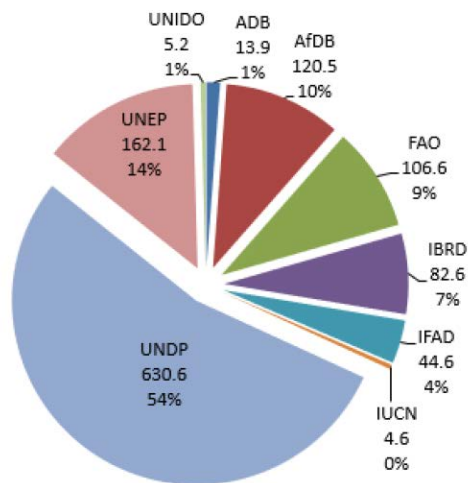

### Agency Involvement in LDCF Projects

14. As at March 31, 2019, nine GEF Agencies were involved in LDCF projects and programs totaling \$1,170.62 million. According to the GEF Trustee Report, UNDP is the agency with the largest share of projects to date, with 54 percent; followed by United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), at 14 percent and African Development Bank (AfDB) at 10 percent (see Figure 3, from the Trustee report). Other GEF Agencies include: Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), World Bank, International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD), Asian

Development Bank (ADB), International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN), and United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO).<sup>23</sup>

### Expected Results under the LDCF

15. As of the end of this reporting period, 237 projects had been CEO endorsed or approved, or are at various stages of implementation. Of these, 184 projects support NAPA implementation, the NAP process, and the implementation of other elements of the LDC work programme.<sup>24</sup> In total, 156 out of 184 implementation-oriented projects that have been CEO endorsed or approved provided an estimate of the number of direct beneficiaries. Key expected results of these projects, including aggregate values of quantitative indicators, are summarized in Table 4 below.

16. These indicators were aligned with the results framework that was introduced in the *GEF Programming Strategy on Adaptation* for the period from July 1, 2014 to June 30, 2018 and refined in the updated results architecture.<sup>25</sup> Full expected results can be found in the results

frameworks specific to each project, available in the project documents posted on the GEF website.<sup>26</sup>

17. In response to the request made at the 14<sup>th</sup> LDCF/SCCF Council in June 2013, the Secretariat, in its Annual Monitoring Review (AMR) of the LDCF and the SCCF, continues to provide a summary of actual, portfolio-level results of projects that have been completed or that are under implementation.<sup>27</sup> The most recent AMR, reporting results from the 2018 fiscal year will be presented at the June 2019 LDCF/SCCF Council.

18. These 156 CEO-endorsed or approved projects seek to directly reduce the vulnerability of more than 21 million people. Given the mandate of the LDCF to support the preparation of the NAP process in LDCs, 83 LDCF projects are already supporting countries in their efforts to integrate climate change adaptation into 228 national development policies, plans and frameworks. The LDCF also assists countries in laying the groundwork for climate-resilient development through 86 projects that will enable countries to strengthen their national climate information services network.

19. The following are examples of CEO endorsed projects during this reporting period, illustrating their expected results and impacts.

20. The project, *Strengthening Resilience and Adaptive Capacity to Climate Change in Sao Tome and Principe's Agricultural and Fisheries Sectors*, implemented by the AfDB, with \$3.5 million from the LDCF, and leveraging more than \$21 million in co-financing; will support the Sao Tomean agriculture and fishery sectors. The project will focus on coastal protection, safety of fishermen amid coastal storms, diversification of resilient cropping to cope with both flood and drought conditions, and support for food value chains to build resilience of local livelihoods. It is expected to provide direct adaptation benefits to over 20,000 people. The project seeks reduce livelihoods vulnerability by improving the resilience across the food value chain. Communities will be taught about proper food handling, processing, and storage, both for food security and micro-enterprise establishment purposes. Trainings on food hygiene will include information on changes in product availability due to impacts of climate change, targeting mostly female heads-of-households. The project will support communities – particularly women – in expanding incomes across the value chain, moving beyond simple fish catch and agricultural harvest to also handling and processing through microenterprise. Cost-effectiveness and coordination with related in-country initiatives have been considered, as have mitigation measures for potential risks. Local community members are expected to be directly involved in implementation of several of the project components. Knowledge management activities will include the development of field guides, factsheets, trainings and interpretive materials on best practice adaptation technologies and approaches.



21. Another example is the project, *Senegal National Adaptation Plan*, implemented by UNDP and requesting grant financing of with \$2.9 million from the LDCF, and leveraging \$9 million in co-financing; aims to strengthen the capacity of sectoral ministries and local governments to better assess the implications of climate change and to adjust existing policies and budgets for the integration of medium and long-term climate change risks and adaptation measures. The project will finance activities supporting Senegal’s NAP process, the aim of which is sustaining economy-wide medium to long-term adaptation planning and mainstreaming. This LDCF project will address the health, infrastructure, disaster risk management, and agriculture sectors; complementing ongoing initiatives covering the remaining priority sectors identified by Senegal’s Ministry of Environment. The NAP process offers an opportunity to take a more considered approach to adaptation planning in Senegal. By promoting the integration of adaptation investment into key development sectors and territorial plans, it will ensure more resilient and sustainable long-term planning. This project will deliver a coherent national system for adaptation planning, including the requisite capacities, knowledge, resources, budgets and plans; articulated at different levels of governance.

22. In the GEF-7 period, the Updated Results Architecture for the LDCF and SCCF introduces a set of four Core Indicators that LDCF/SCCF projects are expected to track and report, in alignment with the Updated Results Architecture for the GEF Trust Fund.<sup>29,30</sup> They are requested at Project Information Form (PIF) or CEO Approval submission stage, and subsequently at CEO Endorsement, mid-term, and terminal stages. Applicable new reporting features for GEF-7 of the GEF Trust Fund, such as the provision of meta-information for projects by agencies, are also applied to the LDCF/SCCF results framework. The Core Indicators, listed below, will contribute to a section of the GEF Scorecard, focused on adaptation to climate change.

- i. Number of direct beneficiaries (gender-segregated, male/female)
- ii. Number of hectares of land under climate-resilient management
- iii. Number of policies plans and development frameworks that mainstream climate resilience
- iv. Number of people with enhanced capacity to identify climate risk and/or engage in adaptation measures (gender-segregated, male/female)

23. The expected contributions towards these Core Indicators from LDCF projects included in the June 2019 Work Program for approval by the 26<sup>th</sup> LDCF/SCCF Council are presented in the Work Program cover note.<sup>31</sup>

24. The newly approved GEF Gender Policy and GEF Policy on Stakeholder Engagement also apply to LDCF projects.

### **Consultations with Countries with GEF-6 Pipelined Projects**

25. As outlined in the 2018-2022 strategy, LDCF project selection and approval transitioned in GEF-7 to a Work Program model at the start of GEF-7, under which projects selected based on strategic prioritization factors are presented for approval by the LDCF/SCCF Council.

26. With the introduction of a new funding cycle for GEF-7, the 2018-2022 strategy recognized the need to address the pipeline of technically cleared projects from GEF-6. At the time of technical clearance in GEF-6, these projects were deemed to address urgent and immediate adaptation needs in a country driven-manner. At the end of GEF-6, there were 21 projects from 17 countries in the LDCF pipeline requesting a total of \$156 million from the LDCF.

27. As many of these projects have been queued in pipeline for over two years, the new strategy stated that a reassessment of the relevance and timeliness of these projects is necessary, particularly taking into consideration the vision for the GEF-7 adaptation strategy, as well as for pursuing renewed opportunities for integration and cross-cutting programming. The strategy further stated that the Secretariat would hold consultations with those countries with projects in the pipeline at the onset of the GEF-7 period.

28. The consultations, in alignment with broader GEF national planning, aimed to enable countries to develop a plan for LDCF support, in light of the new opportunities presented in the new GEF-7 adaptation strategy. The consultations offered countries opportunities to: (i) Seek more synergistic and harmonized programming with the GEF Trust Fund or other sources; and (ii) Re-evaluate whether and how their existing pipeline proposal(s) remain viable in terms of alignment with the national plan for GEF-7. Countries were then invited to develop or revisit and submit or re-submit proposals according to their respective national plans, which may or may not include updated proposals from the GEF-6 pipeline.

29. During the reporting period, the Secretariat continued to hold consultations with countries with remaining technically cleared projects in the GEF-6 LDCF pipeline, which are summarized in detail in Table 5. These consultations were organized in person and over video-

conference, and when possible held in line with GEF National Consultative Dialogue Initiatives (NDIs) or Extended Constituency Meetings (ECWs).

30. Based on the outcomes of these consultations, four countries<sup>32</sup> confirmed or updated their GEF-6 pipelined projects for consideration for the first LDCF Work Program in December 2018.

31. An additional ten countries (please see Table 5) have re-articulated or re-submitted projects from the GEF-6 pipeline. Of these, projects from seven countries that were technically cleared by the deadline were included in the June 2019 Work Program. Two others are undergoing revision, and one project was technically cleared after the Work Program deadline.

32. Four countries (Benin, Burundi, Sudan, and Malawi) are in the process of further refining their priorities and LDCF project submissions are forthcoming.

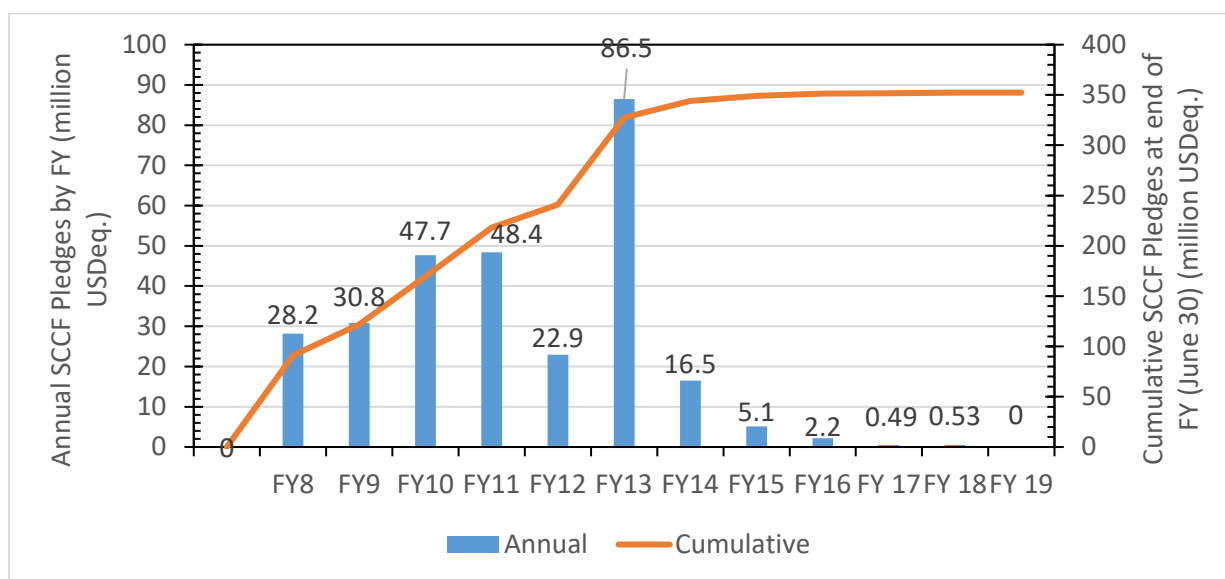
33. The GEF Secretariat will continue its outreach to countries with the aim of concluding the consultation process in the near future. Annex IV presents a summary of GEF-6 pipelined projects as well as their status.

## SPECIAL CLIMATE CHANGE FUND

### Pledges and Contributions to the SCCF

34. As at March 31, 2019, cumulative pledges to the SCCF amounted to \$352.81 million (see Figure 4 below). Of the total resources pledged, \$347.81 million or 99 percent had been received. During the reporting period, a new pledge of \$3.3 million was made by Switzerland to the SCCF.<sup>33</sup>

**Figure 4: Total Annual and Cumulative Pledges to the SCCF by Fiscal Year (\$ millions USDeq.)\***



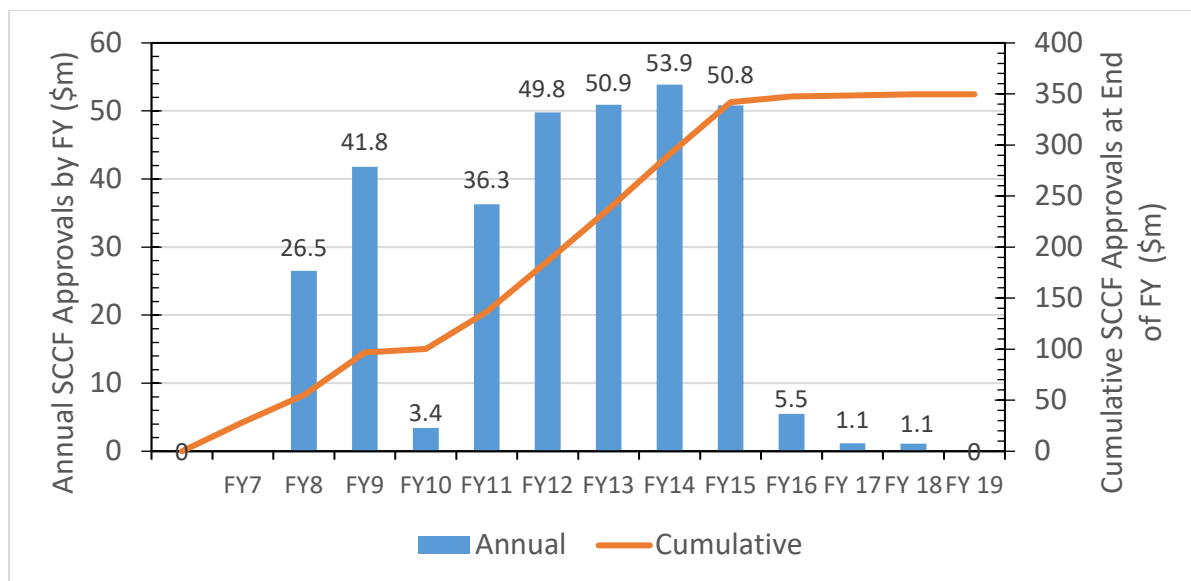

### Progress in SCCF Operations

35. As April 30, 2019, 78 countries had accessed a total of \$353.87 million for 78 projects under the SCCF. Of the total resources approved, \$292.93 million were for 67 projects under the SCCF Adaptation Program (SCCF-A), while twelve projects had been approved under the SCCF Program for Technology Transfer (SCCF-B), with total grant resources amounting to \$60.67 million. Of these projects, one project accessed resources under SCCF-A as well as SCCF-B (See Figure 5 and Table 6). For a complete list of approved projects under SCCF-A and B, please refer to Annex II. One project requesting resources from the SCCF as part of an MTF project is being presented to the 26th LDCF/SCCF Council in June 2019.

## Council Approvals and CEO Endorsements

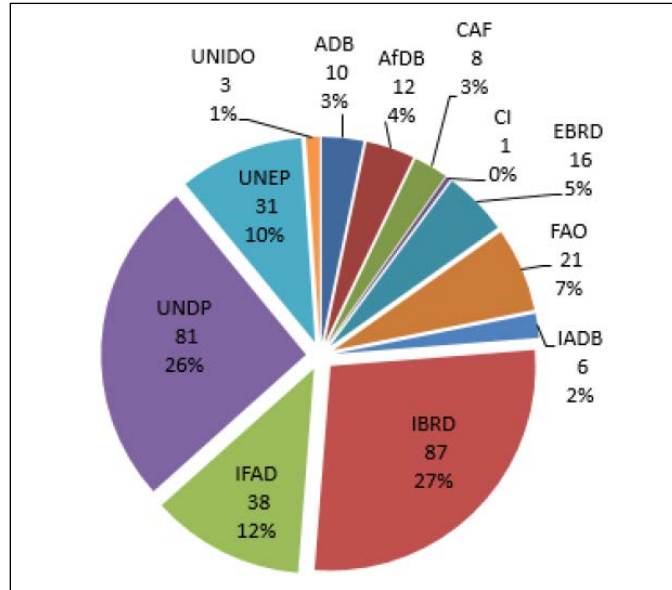
36. During the reporting period, no new projects were approved by the Council or CEO endorsed with SCCF financing. One MTF project requesting SCCF resources is included in the June 2019 LDCF/SCCF Work Program.

## Agency Involvement in SCCF Projects

37. As of March 31, 2019, twelve GEF Agencies were involved in SCCF projects totaling \$315.09 million. According to the Trustee Report, the World Bank holds the largest share of the portfolio at 27 percent, followed by UNDP at 26 percent, 12 percent by IFAD, and 10 percent by UNEP (see Figure 6, from the Trustee report).<sup>34</sup>

### Expected Results under the SCCF

38. By the end of the reporting period, 76 SCCF projects had been endorsed or approved by the GEF and were under some stage of implementation or ready to enter implementation. For these projects, key expected results are summarized in Table 7 below. The summary provides an aggregate value for quantitative indicators used in a critical mass of the 76 projects considered. The indicators are aligned with the results framework that was introduced in the GEF-6 period, similar to the LDCF results.

39. Full expected results are found in the results frameworks specific to each project, available in the project documents posted on the GEF website.<sup>35</sup> In response to the request made at the 14<sup>th</sup> LDCF/SCCF Council in June 2013, the Secretariat, in its Annual Monitoring Reviews of the LDCF and the SCCF, continues to provide a summary of actual, portfolio-level results of projects that have been completed or that are under implementation.<sup>36</sup>

40. In total, 52 out of 76 projects provided an estimated number of direct beneficiaries at the CEO endorsement/approval stage. These projects aim to directly reduce the vulnerability of close to seven million people. In addition, 33 SCCF projects are supporting countries in their

efforts to integrate climate change adaptation into 140 national and sector-wide development policies, plans and frameworks.

41. In the GEF-7 period, the LDCF/SCCF will follow the GEF policy for reporting on Core Indicators, as presented in detail in the Expected Results under the LDCF section.

#### **MULTI-TRUST FUND PROJECTS AND PROGRAMMATIC APPROACHES UNDER THE LDCF AND THE SCCF**

42. To date, there have been a total of 24 projects and four programmatic approaches approved with LDCF/SCCF financing that also draw resources from multiple trust funds. LDCF and SCCF funding associated with these projects and programs amounted to a total of \$104.46 million from the LDCF and \$44.21 million from the SCCF. The figures do not include the three MTFs presented in the June 2019 LDCF/SCCF Work Program.

43. In the past, parallel, rather than coordinated, project approval processes for the GEF Trust Fund and the LDCF/SCCF limited the number of MTF initiatives to be presented to the GEF. Projects that combined GEF Trust Fund and LDCF/SCCF resources often comprised components that were separately mapped to various thematic areas, rather than components that sought to integrate the them. The ambition for GEF-7 is to enable better integration and mainstreaming of adaptation and climate resilience in GEF Trust Fund programming, especially in contexts where vulnerability to climate change is high.

44. Since the roll-out of the new LDCF/SCCF strategy and GEF programming directions in July 2018, the number of MTF proposals that support integration and seeking synergy across different global environmental dimensions has increased. As part of the June 2019 LDCF/SCCF Work Program, two MTF projects, one of which is a program, requesting resources from the LDCF and one requesting resources from the SCCF are under consideration for approval. The December 2018 Work Program also included one MTF project. This ability to support integration and mainstreaming of adaptation with support from multiple trust funds is a unique feature of the GEF. The GEF Secretariat will continue its efforts to facilitate such programming as appropriate, taking into consideration national needs, opportunities for systemic impact, and programming priorities.

45. No MTF projects were CEO endorsed during the reporting period.

#### **Challenge Program**

46. In line with the new GEF adaptation strategy, the GEF Council in December 2018 was presented a document<sup>38</sup> on the Challenge Program on Adaptation Innovation. This document includes information on resource allocation, application modality and eligibility, pre-selection criteria for proposals and financial terms for the Program. Based on the Council discussion on

this document, the GEF Secretariat is announcing a Call for Proposals, to be rolled out in the second half of 2019.

47. The Challenge Program aims to contribute to the global goal on adaptation for the Paris Agreement, by supporting initiatives to increase resilience to the adverse impacts of climate change and variability in vulnerable developing countries, and by supporting efforts to build adaptive capacity. The Program seeks to identify, test and highlight innovative adaptation approaches with potential to be replicated and scaled up through cooperation with institutional investors, bilateral or multilateral providers of climate finance, and other sources. By focusing on continuous innovation and learning pertaining to private adaptation solutions, the Challenge Program aims to demonstrate potentially scalable, bankable or otherwise fundable investment approaches, business models, partnerships and technologies.

48. The initial envelope of \$10 million for the Challenge Program includes \$5 million from the SCCF and \$5 million from the LDCF. All developing countries are eligible to benefit from SCCF funding under the Challenge Program, while only LDCs are eligible for Challenge Program resources. Resources come from the global/regional set aside under the LDCF, and the SCCF.
