I. INTRODUCTION

1. The Least Developed Countries Fund for Climate Change (LDCF) and the Special Climate Change Fund (SCCF) were established by the Global Environment Facility (GEF) in response to guidance from the Conference of the Parties (COP) to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC)¹. The operations and administrative costs incurred in connection with managing both the LDCF and the SCCF are kept separate from the GEF Trust Fund.

2. This paper reports on the current status and approved operations under the LDCF and the SCCF.

II. LEAST DEVELOPED COUNTRIES FUND (LDCF)

Report on NAPA Operations under the LDCF

3. Since the last Council meeting, two additional National Adaptation Programme of Action (NAPA) have been completed (Chad, and Togo), bringing the total of completed NAPAs to 44.

4. To date, the countries that have completed their NAPAs are: Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Benin, Bhutan, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Cambodia, Cape Verde, Central African Republic, Chad, Comoros, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Djibouti, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Gambia, Guinea, Guinea Bissau, Haiti, Kiribati, Lao People's Democratic Republic, Lesotho, Liberia, Madagascar, Malawi, Maldives, Mali, Mauritania, Mozambique, Niger, Rwanda, Samoa, Sao Tomé and Príncipe, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Solomon Islands, Sudan, Togo, Tuvalu, Uganda, United Republic of Tanzania, Vanuatu, Yemen and Zambia.

5. In addition, 4 NAPAs are in the final stages of preparation and are expected to be completed before the end of 2010 (Angola, Myanmar, Nepal and Timor-Leste). A complete list of NAPAs and their current status can be found in Table 1. Additionally, all completed NAPAs can be accessed through the UNFCCC website on the web links listed in Table 1.

Report on Project Operations and Submissions of Projects for NAPA Implementation under the LDCF

6. Since the last LDCF/SCCF Council meeting in November 2009, and as of April 30, 2010, there are seven new countries (Benin, Congo DR, Maldives, Mali, Rwanda, Tuvalu, and Zambia) that have completed the project preparation phase, submitted finalized project documents and received CEO endorsement or approval depending on the size of the project. This brings the number of CEO endorsed/approved LDCF projects to sixteen. All these projects are now starting implementation and will generate adaptation benefits for some of the most vulnerable people in the world.

7. Two further CEO endorsements (Djibouti and Liberia) are currently under review at the GEF Secretariat.

8. Twelve more projects (Cambodia (UNEP), Comoros, Gambia, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Haiti (UNDP+FAO), Lao PDR, Lesotho, Malawi, Sierra Leone, Vanuatu) are expected to move to the implementation phase before the end of 2010.

9. Three project PIFs (Cambodia (UNEP), Samoa (2nd submission), and Tanzania) have been Council approved since November 2009.

10. To sum up, as of April 30, 2010, thirty-eight countries have officially submitted their NAPA implementation projects to the GEF through the Project Identification Form (PIF) for NAPA implementation under the LDCF. Among these PIFs, thirty-six have already been approved as consistent with the LDCF eligibility criteria in the following countries: Bangladesh, Benin, Bhutan, Burkina Faso, Cambodia², Cape Verde, Comoros, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Djibouti, Eritrea, Gambia, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Haiti, Kiribati, Lao PDR, Lesotho, Liberia, Malawi, Maldives, Mali³, Mauritania, Niger, Rwanda, Samoa⁴, São Tomé and Príncipe, Sierra Leone, Sudan, Tanzania, Tuvalu, Vanuatu, Yemen and Zambia.

Status of the LDCF/SCCF financing process

11. The draft LDCF & SCCF programming strategy was discussed with donors at the margins of the 2nd, 3rd and 5th GEF-5 replenishment meetings in Washington (June 26, 2009), Paris (October 16, 2009), and Rome (March 10, 2010). In response to donor comments, the draft LDCF & SCCF programming strategy has been updated and continues to evolve. A financing meeting is scheduled to take in fall 2010.

12. During the 5th GEF-5 replenishment meeting in Rome, the United States announced their intention to pledge \$50 million for the LDCF and SCCF (of which \$30 million will be for the LDCF).

Least Developed Countries Expert Group (LEG) workshops on NAPA implementation

13. The Least Developed Countries Expert Group (LEG) is organizing a series of regional training workshop for LDC government stakeholders to further facilitate their preparation of a NAPA implementation strategy and access to LDCF financing. The workshops are funded through the LDCF and bilateral sources, and are facilitated by the UNFCCC Secretariat. The GEF was invited and participated in all workshops as a key speaker and partner to explain and clarify the LDCF project cycle, how to access LDCF resources and technical requirements for LDCF NAPA implementation proposals. The GEFs participation was highly appreciated by the organizers and participants. The workshops have proved very successful in furthering the interaction and understanding between the LDCs and the GEF Secretariat as well as in building national and capacity to access LDCF financing and to develop adaptation programs and projects.

14. Five regional workshops are planned, of which three have already taken place: Dar Es Salaam, Tanzania 19-23 October 2009 (Anglophone African LDCs), Bamako, Mali 8-12 February 2010 (Francophone African LDCs), and Vientiane, Lao PDR 4-8 May 2010. The remaining workshops will take place during the 2nd half of 2010.

III. SPECIAL CLIMATE CHANGE FUND (SCCF)

Update on COP guidance, Council Decisions

15. The Special Climate Change Fund (SCCF) finances activities related to climate change that are complementary to those funded by the GEF, including:

- (a) adaptation to climate change;
- (b) technology transfer;
- (c) energy, transport, industry, agriculture, forestry and waste management; and
- (d) economic diversification.

16. Initially, the GEF received guidance from the COP to craft funding guidelines for items (a) and (b), only. At COP 12, the GEF Secretariat received additional guidance on how to operationalize a program in the areas of (c) and (d). The subsequent results can be found in document GEF/LDCF.SCCF.2/4/Rev.1, *Programming to Implement the Guidance for the Special Climate Change Fund adopted by the Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change at its Twelfth Session*.

Report on project operations and submissions of projects under the Adaptation Program (SCCF-A)

17. The current number of work programme (and PIF) approved projects in the SCCF adaptation programme is twenty-two (6 MSPs and 16 FSPs) totaling \$92.23137 million.

18. Recent encashments of previous pledges to the SCCF-A have made an amount of almost \$9 million available for new project allocations. With new pledges also expected to be encashed in the near future, the GEF Secretariat is currently working with the Implementing Agencies to put together an intersessional SCCF work program that will be presented to the LDCF/SCCF Council later this year.

19. The demand for SCCF adaptation resources remain high and significantly exceeds current supply in the SCCF. A significant increase in donor contributions is therefore urgently needed.

20. The draft LDCF & SCCF programming strategy was discussed with donors at the margins of the 2nd, 3rd and 5th GEF-5 replenishment meetings in Washington (June 26, 2009), Paris (October 16, 2009), and Rome (March 10, 2010). In response to donor comments, the LDCF & SCCF programming strategy has been updated and continues to evolve. A financing meeting will take in October 2010.

21. During the 5th GEF-5 replenishment meeting in Rome, the United States announced their intention to pledge \$50 million for the LDCF and SCCF (of which \$20 million for the SCCF)

Report on project operations and submissions of projects under the Technology Transfer Program (SCCF-B)

22. The current number of work program approved projects under the Technology Transfer (TT) program is three totaling \$14.335 million.

23. In November 2008, the Council approved the Strategic Program on Technology Transfer, which included a funding window of \$40 million with \$15m coming from the SCCF B and \$35m from the GEF Trust Fund.

24. The PIF for a global project for TNA was approved in the April 2009 Intersessional Work Program by the LDCF/SCCF Council and endorsed by the CEO in August 2009. The TNA project will provide targeted financial and technical support to assist developing countries in carrying out improved TNAs within the framework of Article 4.5 of the UNFCCC.

25. Based on COP14 guidance, a call for proposals for Technology Transfer Pilot Projects was issued in March 2009. 39 projects were submitted to the GEF Secretariat to be funded from GEF Trust Fund and SCCF. Of these, two FSPs were approved by the LDCF/SCCF Council in November 2009 for SCCF funding.
