Other Information

1. Directions to the Venue:

The CCV is adjacent to many international organizations in Geneva. It takes about ten minutes to reach the CCV from the city center and the main railway station (Genève Cornavin). It takes 15 to 20 minutes to reach CCV from the international airport (Genève Cointrin).

Public transport in Geneva is excellent, and the Unireso ticket offers access to municipal public transport. Free tickets (good for 80 minutes) are available at the airport near the baggage claim area. Many hotels also provide transportation tickets for your entire stay. You can also purchase tickets at vending machines that accept Swiss Francs, Euros, and credit cards.

From Geneva Airport (Genève-Cointrin, 5km):

- Bus n° 5 to Thônex-Vallard, stop at Vermont;
- Bus n° 10 to Rives, stop at Gare Cornavin; from there see above. More information can be found at: www.tpg.ch;
- By Train: throughout the day, all trains leaving the airport stop at Cornavin main station. Look for the "Gare CFF" or "Cornavin" signs. More information can be found at: www.cff.ch.
- By Taxi: the fare is around CHF 35.-/40.

From Geneva railway station (Genève-Cornavin, 2km):

- Bus n° 5 to Aéroport, stop at Vermont or Varembé;
- Bus n° 8 to OMS, stop at UIT (International Telecommunications Union);
- Tram n° 15 to Nations, stop at Nations.

2. Weather in Geneva:

Typical temperatures in Geneva in mid-April average from 7 to 15°C.

3. Power outlets:

Electricity in Switzerland comes with 230V at 50Hz (although some hotels might offer 110V two-pin sockets for electric razors). The plugs in use are the two-pin Europlug CEE 7/16, and the three-pin Swiss SEV 1011 (Type J).



Power plugs with two pins (CEE 7/16) can fit both CEE 7/16 and SEV 1011 sockets. In particular, travel adapters with a CEE 7/16 male end can power laptop computers, even if the laptop has a three-pin cable.

4. Time zone:

Switzerland is in the Central European Time zone (UTC+1 in winter).

5. Money:

Switzerland uses the Swiss Franc (CHF). Euros may occasionally be accepted, and can be used in most vending machines, including those of the Geneva public transports.

Indicative rates (as of February 3, 2013)¹ for one Swiss Franc (1 CHF): EUR 0.820; USD 1.110; JPY 112.018; GBP 0.681; CAD 1.232.

Credit cards are widely accepted. The most commonly accepted credit cards are Visa and Mastercard.

6. Banking:

The closest bank office is that of the Union de Banques Suisses (UBS) located at 17, chemin Louis-Dunant. It is open from 8:30 to 16:30 during the week. There are Automatic Teller Machines outside of the bank building.

7. Tipping:

Prices at hotels, restaurants and taxis are calculated to include taxes and service fees. Therefore, tips are at the client's discretion but are often around 5% or 10% of the check.

8. Emergency numbers:

Emergency numbers can be reached free of charge from any payphone or from any mobile phone.

The most useful emergency number is the inter-service European emergency number: 112

Specific services can be reached at the following numbers:

- 144: Medical emergencies
- 118: Fire brigade
- 117: Police

9. Tourism:

Known both as the "smallest of big cities", or the "city of peace", Geneva, among other things, is home to the European headquarters of the United Nations. The quayside of Lake Geneva, the parks, the old alleyways and smart boutiques are an invitation to a leisurely stroll.
