


### Q1. Lessons learned to be effective

## Watch Afghanistan's Breakout Discussion



### ♦ILLIGAL WILDLIFE TRADE (IWT)

- > 580 people (119 females and 109 youths) from government and
- academia participated in the workshops
- 1,350 snow leopard posters and 1,200 snow leopard anti poaching sticker distributed in Wakhan Valley.
- ➤ Each year ~1,600 women and children receive training NRM including messages on the impact of IWT

#### \* IWT MONITORING

- Interviewed 291 pet traders, medicinal shops and restaurar owners
- Introduced Spatial Motoring and Reporting Tool in W
- > 30 community rangers in WNP trained in use of SMART
- Community rangers in WNP equipped with digital SMAR devices

# Q2. Key challenges & opportunities



- Building/maintaining engagement maintaining the right range of topics and opportunities, 'sleepers' and 'cousins'
- Low capacity to identify and prepare lessons learned, but an opportunity to re-invigorate agendas?
- Knowledge transfer to local levels gaps in national knowledge platforms, but an opportunity for training in outreach, engagement and KM to projects?
- Accessibility (technology, languages, timezones) and sustainability when projects end











- Encouraging programs to collaborate and recognize the benefits from doing so
- Help connect program teams and identify technical overlap areas
   e.g. email newsletter, sharing contact list of program teams, sharing events
- Identify lessons and good practices and use them to inform GEF-8 IPs
