Report: Biennial Transparency Reports (BTR)


Provision of timely BTR1 support is a priority for GEF

49 BTRs in 48 countries supported since 2020

Every technically cleared proposal supported As of September 21, 2022:

- \$35.2 million to support BTRs
- BTR1 (48), BTR2 (1)
- Stand-alone BTR1 (20), Combined BTR1/NC (27), Other (1)
- Brazil, India and Nigeria and Malaysia used their STAR




Report: National Communications (NC)

521 NCs supported since 1995

- 152 countries
- \$299 million total
- Up to \$500,000 from set-aside
- Top up with STAR resources in some countries

Capacity: Capacity Building Initiative for Transparency

Growing, balanced portfolio

- 88 projects in 86 countries totaling \$145 million
- +84% of portfolio under implementation
- 32 projects in Africa, 22 in LAC, 20 in Asia and 9 in ECA
- 5 global projects to enhance knowledge exchange, sector capacity
- 7 Agencies: CI, FAO, FECO, IDB, UNEP, UNDP, and WWF-US


Regional Distribution of CBIT Portfolio







Capacity: Capacity building Initiative for Transparency



Global Support Program (GSP)

- Started in 2015 by UNEP and UNDP, concluded in September 2021
- Reviews, technical support and backstopping of NCs and BURs
- Training, best practices on GHG inventories, IPCC guidelines
- Gender mainstreaming, vulnerability & adaptation assessments, mitigation actions
- South-South communities of practice
- Supported over 140 countries

CBIT GSP:

Unified Support Platform and Program for Article 13

- Phase IIA + IIB as a package, with UNEP
- Phase IIA cleared for implementation in July 2021
- Phase IIB cleared for implementation in December 2021
- Provide streamlined support and capacity building at country, regional, and global level to enable countries better respond to reporting requirements
- Catalyze increased ambition within NDCs

ETF support: GEF-8 Outlook

GEF-8 (July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2026)



- CBIT: \$75 million in GEF-8 (up from \$55 million in GEF-7)
- Reporting: \$145 million in GEF-8 (up from \$110 million in GEF-7)

ETF support



- Growing demand for CBIT and BTR towards 2024 deadline
- Anticipate requests for second CBIT "phase" support
- Explore interlinkages and align BTR and CBIT projects
- Engage with COP Presidency, UNFCCC, countries, and partners


- 7. Further requests the Global Environment Facility to contribute to the consideration of the support provided to developing country Parties referred to in decision 5/CMA.3, paragraph 42, by:
 - (a) Estimating the cost to developing countries of implementing the enhanced transparency framework, which includes establishing and enhancing a reporting system, as well as the full agreed cost of reporting and the cost of capacity-building for reporting;

Methodology

Contributing Agencies: 7 GEF Agencies (CI, FAO, FECO, IADB, UNDP, UNEP, WWF-US)

Sample: 100% of the CBIT portfolio (88 approved projects)

Reporting system elements considered:

- Tracking progress in mitigation
- Tracking progress in adaptation
- Tracking support needed & received
- GHG inventory

- NDC enhancement
- IT infrastructure
- Other elements






CBIT portfolio includes GEF project grant, project preparation grant and Agency fee

Distribution of reporting systems elements





Conclusions

- Developing countries are investing substantially on establishing and enhancing their reporting systems under the ETF. More than 93% of the CBIT projects include support for at least one element of reporting systems.
- Countries have flexibility to prioritize specific system elements through their CBIT projects, in line with their specific needs and circumstances. The analysis shows significant diversity in the reporting systems elements being supported through CBIT.
- **GHG inventory** is the reporting system element that has received the most support of the CBIT portfolio to date (19%, \$28M), followed by tracking **progress in mitigation** (11%, \$16M) and **IT infrastructure** (9%, \$12M).
- There have been significant developments from Glasgow to Sharm el Sheikh: with the GEF-8 replenishment, set aside funds for reporting increased to \$145M (up from \$110M) and CBIT to \$75M (from \$55M). The GEF will continue to support the ETF implementation and countries can continue to invest CBIT resources to establish and further enhance reporting systems.
