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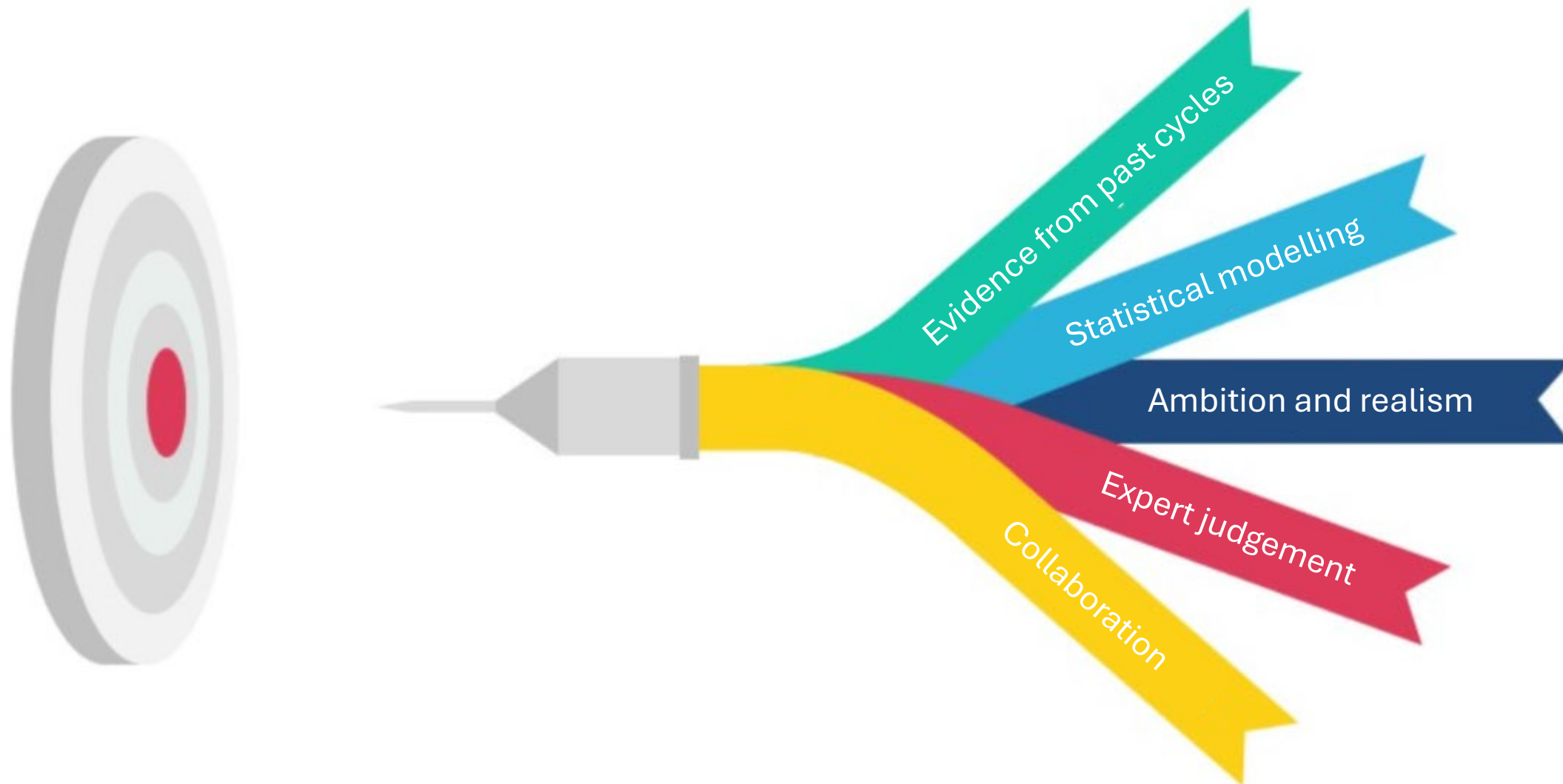


Focal Area Priorities – Set Aside and Integration Incentives

- All focal areas include set asides for Enabling Activities in line with COP guidance, as well as incentives for countries to participate in the Integrated Programs and for the Global Platforms.
- In GEF-8, 32% of all GEF-8 resources were programmed in Integrated Programs (STAR and incentive).
- In GEF-9, we aim to program closer to 45% of all resources in IPs, and the incentive ratio will be 1:4.

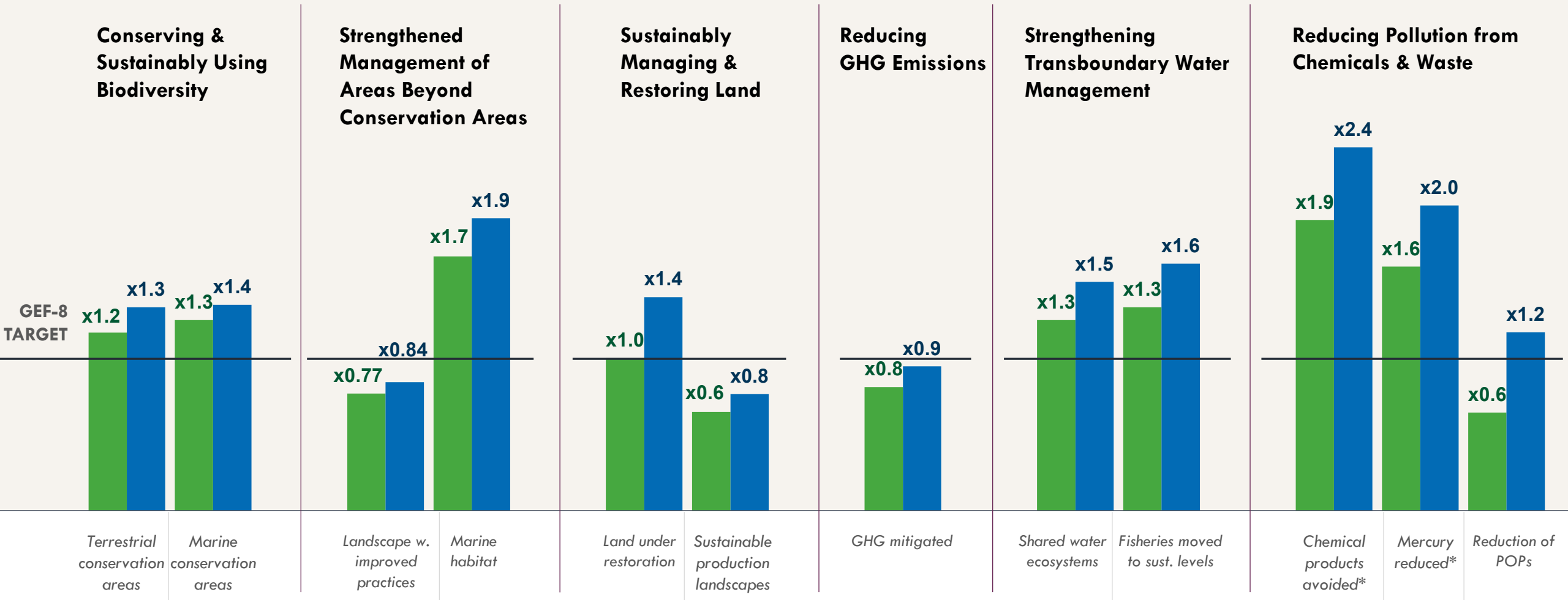




GEF-9 targets

relative to GEF-8 targets

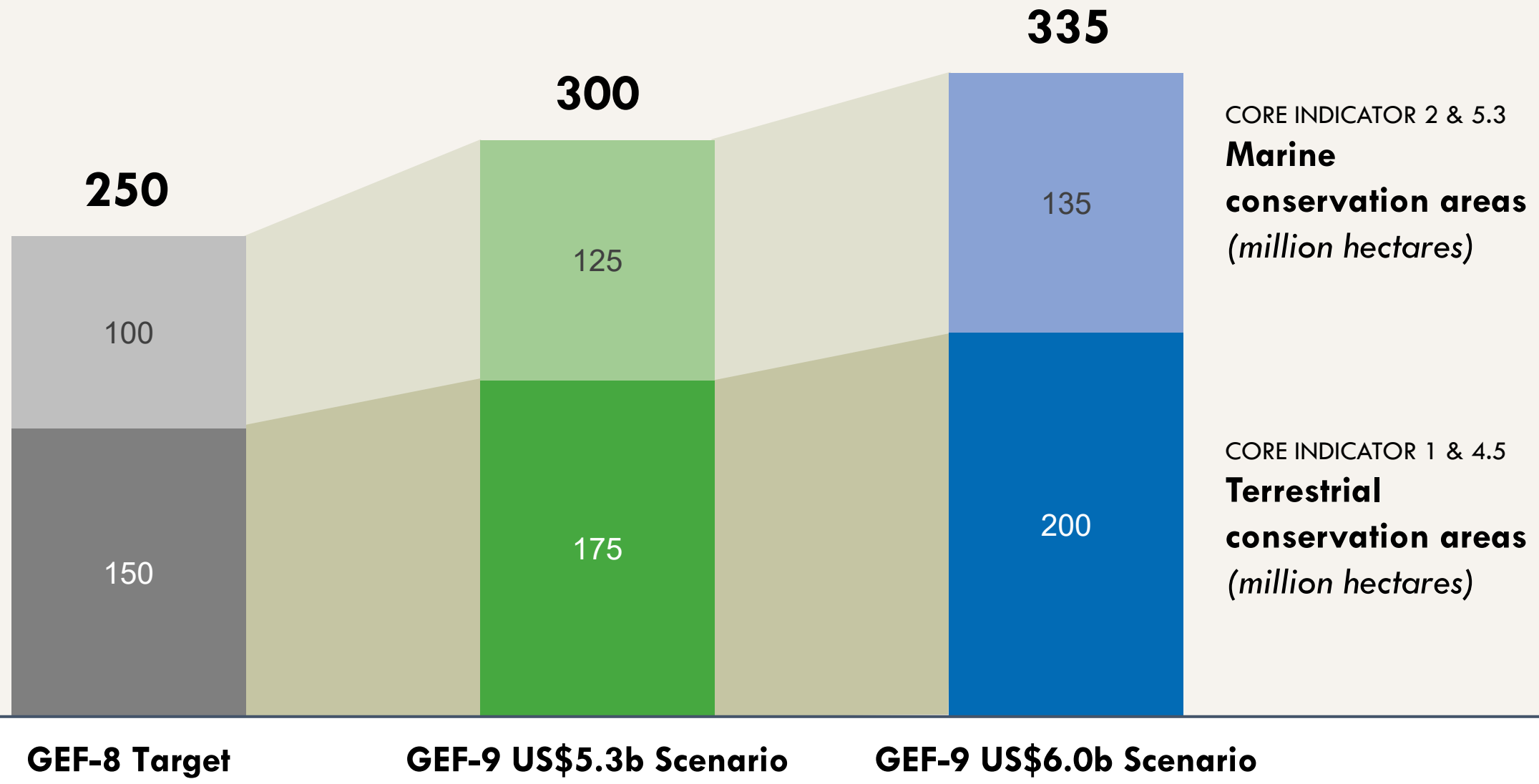
\$5.3B GEF-9 Scenario | **\$6.0B GEF-9 Scenario**

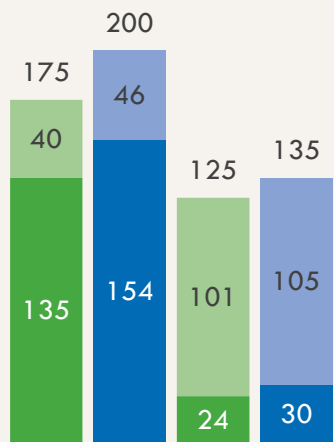

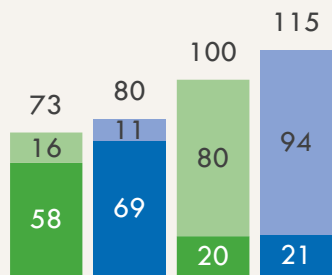

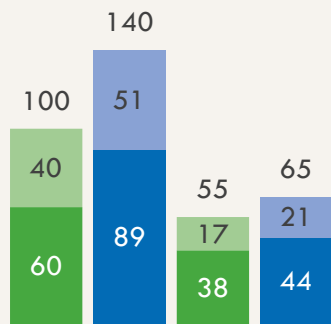

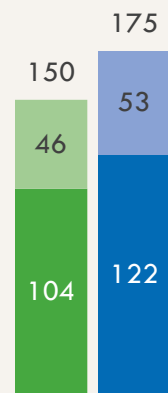
Strengthened Management of Areas Beyond Conservation Areas



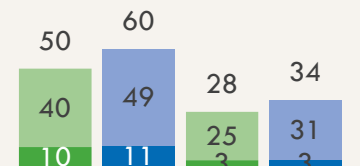

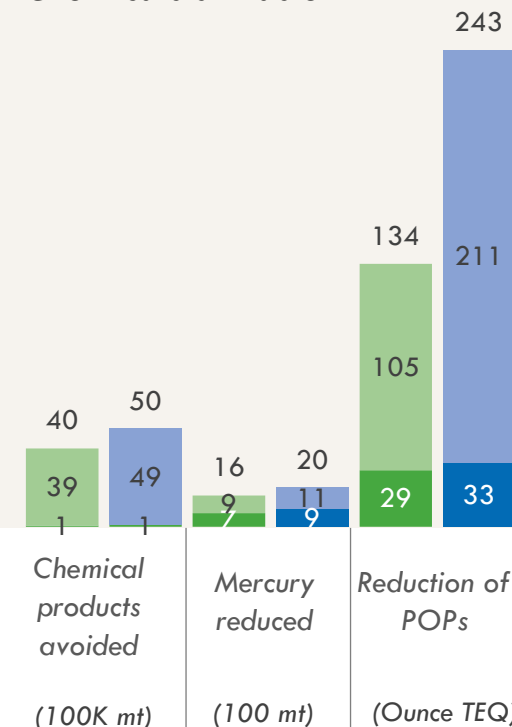

Rio Markers track integrated environmental finance with assorted targets

WHY

- OECD-DAC–recognized framework to track alignment with the Rio Conventions
- Ensures transparency and captures integrated environmental outcomes

HOW IT WORKS

- Objective-based scoring: Principal (2) or Significant (1)
- Captures synergies across climate, biodiversity, and land
- GEF Corporate Scorecard tracks progress twice a year
- GEF-8 targets have been met

GEF-9 IMPLICATIONS

- Maintaining GEF-8 targets in GEF-9:
 - 80% for climate-related
 - 65% for mitigation
 - 45% for adaptation
 - 60% for biodiversity
 - 50% for desertification
- Supported by guidance, training, and methodological refinement
