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CBIT and GEF's Role

Paris Decision Paragraph 86:

<u>Urges and requests the GEF to make arrangements to</u> <u>support the establishment and operation of the CBIT</u> as a priority reporting-related need, including through:

- voluntary contributions to support developing country Parties in the sixth replenishment of the GEF
- and future replenishment cycles
- to complement existing support under the GEF



Steps Taken toward CBIT Establishment

- Technical consultations with existing/emerging initiatives, UNFCCC, GEF partner Agencies (April)
- ✓ Outreach and briefing at Bonn climate meeting (May)
- ✓ GEF Council approved CBIT Trust Fund establishment and Programming Directions documents (June)
- ✓ CBIT Trust Fund establishment approved by World Bank (*August*)
- CEO notification to GEF operational focal points (August)
 Donors working with Trustee on contributions
 Envision first set of project approvals by COP 22



Key Features of CBIT Programming

✓ CBIT Programming Directions

- Programming at national level and global/regional level
- Eligibility to access support and priorities
- Results and indicators
- Engagement with relevant entities and alignment
- GEF policies and program cycle to apply



Eligibility

In line with the Paris Agreement and its decision, all developing country Parties will have access to CBIT, upon request



Aims of CBIT

Paris Decision (Paragraph 85):

- To strengthen national institutions for transparencyrelated activities in line with national priorities;
- To provide relevant tools, training and assistance for meeting the provisions stipulated in Article 13 of the Agreement; and
- To assist in the improvement of transparency over time.





CBIT national level support

- Developing countries to request resources to implement priorities to build capacity to meet enhanced transparency needs
- Non-exhaustive menu of options under three CBIT aims:
 - Activities to strengthen national institutions for transparency-related activities in line with national priorities;
 - 2) Activities to provide relevant tools, training, and assistance for meeting the provisions stipulated in Article 13;

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3) Activities to assist with improvement of transparency over time.



- 1. Activities to strengthen national institutions for transparencyrelated activities in line with national priorities:
 - Support to national institutions to lead, plan, coordinate, implement, monitor, and evaluate policies, strategies, and programs to enhance transparency;
 - ✓ Support on how to integrate knowledge from transparency initiatives into national policy and decision-making; and
 - ✓ Assistance with deployment and enhancement of information and knowledge management structure to meet Article 13 needs.



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3) Activities to assist with improvement of transparency over time.



- 2. Activities to provide relevant tools, training, and assistance for meeting the provisions stipulated in Article 13:
 - ✓ Access to tools, templates, and applications to facilitate the use of improved methodologies, guidelines, datasets, and database system tools and economic models;
 - Country-specific training and peer exchange programs on transparency activities such as establishing domestic MRV systems, tracking NDCs, enhancement of GHG inventories and economic and emissions projections;
 - \checkmark Country-specific emissions factors and activity data;
 - \checkmark Quantifying and reporting impact of policy measures;
 - ✓ Clarifying key NDC information, e.g. baseline projections including for businessas-usual targets, and reporting progress towards achieving NDCs; and

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 \checkmark Quantifying and reporting on support provided and received.



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- 3. Activities to assist with improvement of transparency over time:
 - Capacity needs assessment for transparency, in particular to assess institutional arrangement for data collection, analysis, and reporting; and
 - ✓ Support to introduce and maintain progress tracking tools for transparency-related actions and progress towards targets/goals.
