Expanding on the integrated supply chain approach the Global Environment Facility (GEF) initiated two years ago, the recently launched groundbreaking **Food, Land Use and Restoration (FOLUR) Impact Program** is intended to promote a transformational shift in agricultural land use and food system. The program supports a systems approach that brings strategies and stakeholders together through both horizontal and vertical dimensions.

The session will explore the evolving FOLUR program and how it can break perceived trade-offs between driving economic growth through expansion of food crops and commodities and pursuing environmental sustainability that shifts the footprint of the global food system. It will identify how to harmonize interests across different government ministries, show how transformation across the value chain can drive change on both supply and demand, and discuss the important role that multi-stakeholder entities including the private sector can play in bridging the gap between key actors and across interests.
