Dear Council Member:

I am writing in reference to my letter of March 11, 2013, under cover of which we circulated for GEF Council review and approval of the April 2013 Intersessional Work Program.

I am pleased to inform you that the Council has approved by mail the proposed work program as amended.

The approved decision, taking into account Council Members' comments, reads as follows:

The GEF Council reviewed the proposed work program¹ posted on March 11, 2013, and approves the work program as amended,² comprising of the following 51 Project Identification Forms (PIFs), one Program Framework Document (PFD) and one PIF associated with a previously approved programmatic approach, subject to the comments submitted to the Secretariat by April 8, 2013:

With respect to the following five PIFs approved as part of the work program, the Council requested the Secretariat to arrange for Council Members to receive draft final project documents at least four weeks prior to the CEO's endorsing the project document for final approval by the GEF Agency to provide Council Members the opportunity to transmit to the CEO any concerns they may have:

- a) **Dominican Republic :** Conserving Biodiversity in Coastal Areas Threatened by Rapid Tourism and Physical Infrastructure Development;
- b) Egypt: Grid-Connected Small-Scale Photovoltaic Systems;
- c) Kenya: Development of SFM and Support to REDD for Dryland Forests;
- d) Solomon Islands: Integrated Forest Management in the Solomon Islands;
- e) EAS Regional (China): Implementation of the Yellow Sea LME Strategic Action Programme for Adaptive Ecosystem-Based Management under the EAS Regional: Reducing Pollution and Rebuilding Degraded Marine Resources in the East Asian Seas through Implementation of Intergovernmental Agreements and Catalyzed Investments

With respect to the following three PIFs, the Council requests that the project proposals be deferred for consideration at the June 2013 Council meeting.

- b) Russian Federation: Save the Source: Catalyzing Market Transformation of Breweries from a Major Natural Resource Consuming Industry to a Pro-active Steward for Resource Efficient Cleaner Production (UNIDO);
- c) Russian Federation: Sustainable Land Management and Ecosystem-based Climate Change Mitigation in the Altai-Sayan Ecoregion (UNDP)

With respect to the remaining 47 PIFs and one PFD approved as part of the work program, the Council finds that each of these PIFs/PFD (i) is, or would be, consistent with the Instrument and GEF policies and procedures and (ii) may be endorsed by the CEO for final approval by the GEF Agency, provided that the final project documents fully incorporate and address the Council's and the STAP reviewer's comments on the work program, and that the CEO confirms that the project continues to be consistent with the Instrument and GEF policies and procedures.

With respect to any PIF approved in this work program, the final project document will be posted on the GEF website for information after CEO endorsement. If the GEF CEO determines that there have been major changes to the project scope and approach since PIF approval, the final project document shall be posted on the web for Council review for four weeks prior to CEO endorsement.

Beginning in this work program, the new procedure for tranche fee payment will apply to all projects in which 40% of the Agency fees are committed upon approval of this work program and the remaining 60% at CEO endorsement. The detailed funding decisions taken by the Council is appended as Annex 1.
